LOCAL INTELLIGENCE.

Defending the Revenue—Being a Custom-house Officer.
The examination of this case, which was over from Tuesday evening last, was yesterday resumed before the U. S. Commissioner, the Hon. Joshua Baldwin.

On the first evening's examination, William Harding of the house of Meyer, Babian & Co. proved to two different invoices and bills of lading, then in court. One of these invoices gives the value of the cigars, including charges, at \$600.60.

On opening the proceedings, Mr. Schmidt moved as counsel for the accused, that the charge against him be dismissed, on the ground that Babian pleaded in avoidance of the proceedings against him, that Joshua Baldwin is not an assessor, a Commissioner of the United States, but that he never been appointed by the Fifth Circuit Court, sitting for the Eastern District of Louisiana, nor is he authorized to act as such, nor by any other competent authority.

Five Hundred Dollars Bail—Alexander McAdams, charged before Recorder Caldwell, by his wife, with assault and battery, was yesterday held in \$500 to keep the peace.

Examination Resumed.—The documents were received in the month of March; he did not open the letter; it was directed to Babian & Co.; he never saw the documents until he was arrested; he did not know of his own knowledge where Mr. Babian was in business on his own account before he suggested to Babian many things, which, generally speaking, it was his opinion he, Babian, did not follow; he held the general power of attorney for the firm up to the 25th; his recollection was published in the papers on the 20th; witness learned a great portion of his commercial knowledge in New Orleans; arrived here 10th of January, 1882; same from Tampico; was employed there as a collector of duties; there in August, 1834; did not remember the house of Harcourt & Co. there, nor the house of Harcourt; remembered the house of Taylor and some others; never counted the commercial houses in Tampico; remembered the house of Zimmerman & Co. was in the employ of John Whitman & Co. here; knew Mr. Metayre for some time; spoke to Mr. Metayre for the first time some time in last spring, on the race track; had only two interviews with him since; witness, discharge; he never considered Mr. Metayre an intimate acquaintance.
