Optimistic Railroad Survey—The engineers appointed to survey the route of the proposed railroad between New Orleans and Tib-dax, and between the latter place and Burwick's Bay, have, respectively, arrived at Tib-dax, and returned on the discharge of their duties. It is expected that the result of their labors will be laid before the Railroad Convention, to be held on the first Monday in January next.
