CHARTER.

United States of America, State of Louisiana, Parish of St. Tammany.

BE IT KNOWN, That on this fifth day of May, in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and two, before me, H. B. Warren, Clerk of the District Court and ex-officio notary public, duly commissioned and sworn, in and for the Parish of St. Tammany, Louisiana, and in the presence of the undersigned witnesses, personally came and appeared the parties whose names are hereunto subscribed, all of full age and majority, who declared that availing themselves of the provisions of the laws of Louisiana, relative to corporations, they hereby covenant, agree and bind themselves, as well as such other persons as may hereafter become associated with them, to form and constitute a corporation and body politic in law, for the purposes and objects, and under the conditions stipulated in the following articles, to-wit:

Article I. The name and title of this corporation shall be BOGUE FALIA CLUB, and its domicile is hereby fixed in the town of Covington, St. Tammany Parish, La.

objects and purposes, said corporation shall have, possess, enjoy and exercise all the rights, powers and privileges of a body corporate and politic in law.

Article III. This corporation shall continue for the term of ninety-nine (99) years from this day.

Article IV. The capital stock of this corporation shall be fifteen hundred dollars, (\$1500) divided into and represented by thirty (30) shares of fifty (50) dollars each, which stock shall be paid for in full in cash or in installments of not less than twenty-five (25) per cent at intervals of not more than thirty days, as the Board of Directors may determine. Such stock shall be transferable only on the books of this corporation, upon surrender of the certificates therefor.

The stock of this corporation shall be held and owned by the stockholders, subject to the following conditions and agreements which are made a part of the contract of subscription to such stock and which are declared to be binding on the original subscriber to such stock, and upon all persons who may become possessed of such stock either by gift, devise, inheritance, purchase, or in any other manner, to-wit:

1. The possession or ownership of a share of stock does not entitle the possessor or owner to the privileges of the club house, unless he has been elected a member. (2) No individual shall own more than one share of stock. (3) In case any stock holder shall die, resign, be expelled from the corporation as provided in the laws or rules, or be absent from the Parish of St. Tammany for a period of more than one year, without notifying in writing the Board of Directors, of such absence and having such absence approved by such Board in writing, or shall pledge, sell or dispose of his stock; the Board of Directors shall have the right, within three months after it shall be informed of such death, resignation, expulsion or absence, or of such sale, pledge, or disposal of such stock, to purchase such stock for the cash, or to purchase the same by the Board of Directors, and upon the purchase of such share of stock, the certificate representing the same shall be cancelled on the books of the corporation, and such share of stock may again be sold and issued to any person who may be elected a member of the corporation in the manner provided by its rules and by-laws.

Article V. The business and affairs of the club shall be directed and managed by a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Board of Directors consisting of eleven stock holders, four of whom shall be the President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer, and five ex-officio members, all of whom, except the Secretary and Treasurer, shall hold their office for one year or until their successors shall be elected, and they shall exercise all the rights and powers of the corporation, except insofar as restricted by the charter and by laws of the corporation. Citation shall be served on the President, and in his absence, on the Vice President, and in his absence of both, on the Secretary. The Secretary and Treasurer shall be elected by the Board of Directors, and shall be removable at their will. No person who is not a stock holder of this corporation shall be eligible as a Director. The officers and first Board of Directors shall consist of:

H. B. Warren—President. B. M. Miller—Vice President. E. J. Domergue, Jr.—Treasurer. Jos. Delery—Secretary. Directors—E. A. Leonval, Fred Ily, J. M. Thompson, N. G. Pearsall, C. Z. Williams, and E. E. Blossman, and E. E. Brewster. And all of said officers shall hold their offices until the annual meeting on the third Monday of May 1903.

Article VI. The general meeting of the members of this corporation shall take place on the third Monday of May in each year, for the nomination and election of candidates for office, as provided for under Article V, and for the transaction of such other business as may be necessary. The President, or acting President may at any time call a special meeting whenever, in his opinion, it is deemed advisable in the interest of the corporation, and he shall also be his duty so to do when requested in writing by five stockholders. Such meeting shall take place after notice of the day and purpose thereof shall have been posted conspicuously in the club room during seven (7) full days previous to the date of said meeting. At all meetings each stock holder shall have one vote, and shall vote in person, and not by proxy. Sixteen (16) members shall be a quorum for the transaction of business at all meetings, and a decision of a majority of the quorum present shall be valid as a corporate act, save as hereinafter excepted.

Article VII. This corporation is authorized to lease, purchase, hold, mortgage and convey such real estate in the town of Covington or elsewhere, as may be required for the accomplishment of its purposes. It may ordain by-laws, rules and regulations, and alter, amend and abrogate the same at pleasure, except as otherwise provided in this charter or by the laws of Louisiana, and shall generally possess and exercise all the powers incident to a corporation and necessary to carry out the purposes for which it has been organized. It may have a seal with such device and inscription as the officers of the corporation may adopt.

Article VIII. No debts shall be created in any one year in excess of the actual revenues of said year, unless by consent of a majority of the members at a meeting of the corporation. The Board of Directors shall have power to assess and to collect such admission fees and annual dues or assessments, as shall be prescribed by the by-laws or authorized by the corporation. No stock holder or member shall be held liable or responsible for the debts, contracts or debts of said corporation beyond the amount of any dues or assessments which he may owe for the current year.

Article IX. All acts and obligations of this corporation shall be authenticated by the signature of the President and of the Treasurer. Article X. These articles shall not be altered except at a special meeting called for that purpose, after the notice given as provided in Article IV, designating in writing the article or articles that it is proposed to change; and it shall require two-thirds of a legal quorum to alter or amend any article; provided that no article shall be altered or amended at an annual meeting, unless seven (7) days notice of such proposed amendment has been given in the manner provided in Article VI.

Article XI. The dissolution of this Corporation may be proposed at any general meeting at which notice of such dissolution has been given as provided in Article VI, or at any special meeting called for the purpose of effecting such dissolution, and the vote upon the question of dissolution shall be by ballot, the vote upon such question to be held from 9 A. M. to 10 P. M. upon the day on which such meeting is called. In case

of a vote on such dissolution, a majority of the votes cast shall determine, provided that at least one half of the stock holders shall have participated in such vote.

Article XII. Upon the dissolution of this corporation, by the expiration of this charter or otherwise, its affairs shall be liquidated by three commissioners, all of whom shall be stockholders, to be elected by the stockholders at a meeting especially called for that purpose. Such commissioners shall immediately proceed to wind up the affairs of the corporation, and after the payment of its liabilities, shall distribute any remaining funds equally among the stock holders.

Section sixteen, township six, south range fourteen east, in St. Tammany Parish, in quantities of not less than 40 acres nor more than 160 acres, as per plat of survey to be exhibited on the day of sale, after due appraisalment, according to law.
