Commissioner of Agriculture Lee is in receipt of a letter from a member of a large Mercantile firm of New York which reads in part as follows:

"I have applied to the United States Department of Agriculture at Washington for particulars of the centers in which alfalfa or lucerne hay is grown. I am favored with their reply, giving me the State of Louisiana.

"We have been buying from the Argentine, but are looking for fresh sources of supply."

Alfalfa is raised in the Red River valley, more than 4000 acres being in cultivation in the country adjacent to Shreveport. Major Lee will put the producers and merchants in correspondence, and assist in every possible way to develop the interest of the State in the matter.

Professor Stubbs of the Audubon Park Experiment Station, New Orleans, has introduced to the sugar planters of Louisiana a new seedling cane grown from seed imported from Denmark. A test of this cane grown on the Station grounds, gave for the new cane 144 pounds of finest sugar per ton of cane, while the purple and striped canes yielded 111.2 pounds per ton. Sixty tons of this cane have been distributed to the planters of the State. Indications are that the improved cane will gradually supercede the kinds heretofore grown. As far as we know no systematic attempt has been heretofore made to increase the sugar producing qualities of cane, notwithstanding the object lesson afforded by the development of sugar beets.


