Paper From Cotton Seed Hulls.

The success of the Pettibone Contract Company of Niagara Falls in making paper from Cotton-seed hulls means a great deal for the South. The experiment of this company with hulls produced a soft and tough paper, and the opinion was expressed that a good quality of writing paper could be manufactured from the Southern product.

It has always been held that cotton-seed hulls were well adapted for the manufacture of paper, but, as in the case of bagasse, nothing has heretofore been done to put this belief into practical effect. The recent search for paper stock has, as The Times-Democrat has shown, brought about a thorough examination of all the materials that seem adapted to this industry. Three of these materials produced wholly in the South have specially recommended themselves - bagasse or crushed sugar cane, rice straw and cotton-seed hulls. Two paper mills are already converting bagasse into paper, and the industry is in so promising a condition that we can foresee the day when all the crushed cane of the sugar district will find its way to the mill. One paper mill for the utilization of rice straw in the manufacture of paper has been provided for. Less progress has been made in utilizing the cotton-seed hulls for paper making, but the experiments of Niagara hold out great promise for the future. If the hulls prove all that is hoped for, it is, of course, the greatest of all the discoveries in the industry of paper making, as cotton seed hulls are not, like bagasse and rice straw, limited to a small section, but are produced throughout the South. With these three materials for the manufacture of paper fully utilized, we have reason to believe that the South will become the center of the American paper industry. - Times-Democrat.


