The following Budget, License and Per Capita Tax Ordinances were adopted by the Police Jury for the year ending Dec. 31, 1903:

BUDGET.

LICENSE ORDINANCE.

1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Tammany, Louisiana, That a license be and is hereby levied for the year 1903 upon each person, corporation, firm or association pursuing any occupation, business or calling in this parish, which is subject to State license.

2. Be it further ordained, etc., That the amount of license due this parish for each trade, occupation, business or calling, carried on or conducted in this parish, subject to a license, is hereby levied for the year 1903 as follows:

PER CAPITA TAX.

1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of St. Tammany Parish, That besides the two mill tax heretofore set aside for public work purposes, there is hereby levied for the year 1903 a per capita tax of \$1.00 upon each male inhabitant of the parish between the ages of 18 and 55 years, except parties who live in cities and towns that keep up their own streets, this tax to be collected as provided by law, and to be paid by the 31st of December, 1903, and each year thereafter, and that any person failing to pay his per capita tax as above levied, shall be fined in the sum of not less than \$5 or more than \$15, and in default of the payment of the fine and costs, he shall be sentenced to work on the public road for a period of time not to exceed 30 days at the discretion of the court.

2. Be it further ordained, etc., That said prosecution shall be conducted before the District Court.

LICENSE ORDINANCE.

Be it enacted by the Town Council of the town of Covington, La., That a license tax for the year 1903 is hereby levied upon all corporations, firms, persons or individuals pursuing any trade, occupation, business or calling in this town, which is subject to a State license.

Be it further enacted, etc., That the amount of said taxes to be the same as is now collected by the State, for the same kind of trade, occupation, business or calling.

Be it further enacted, That the Marshal be instructed to proceed to collect the license due the town for the year 1903 according to law.

VAGRANT ORDINANCE.

An ordinance defining Vagrancy, and providing for the suppression of same. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the town of Covington, Louisiana, That all idle persons who, not having visible means to maintain themselves, live without employment; all persons wandering abroad and lodging in groceries, taverns, beer houses, barrooms, market places, sheds, barns, uninhabited buildings, or in the open air, and not giving a good account of themselves; all persons wandering abroad and begging, or who go about from door to door, or place themselves in the streets, highways, passages, or other public places, to beg or receive alms; habitual drunkards who shall abandon, neglect, or refuse to aid in the support of their families, shall be deemed vagrants.

That it shall be the duty of the Marshal or other peace officer of the town, whenever required by any person, or when he has personal knowledge of such vagrant, to carry him before the Mayor of the town for examination; if the Mayor be satisfied by the confession of the offender, or by competent testimony, that he is a vagrant within the description aforesaid, he shall make certificate of the same, which he shall keep on file in his office; and the Mayor shall issue a warrant to commit such vagrant to the town jail for a period of time not exceeding six months, there to be kept and worked on the streets of the town.

Be it further ordained, That this ordinance shall go into effect after thirty days advertisement in the official journal.

BANQUETTE ORDINANCE.

An Ordinance to require property owners on Columbia street, from Kirkland street to Rutland street, and on Gibson street from New Hampshire street to Columbia street, to build sidewalks or banquettes and curbing along the front of their property. Be it ordained by the Mayor and

Aldermen of the Town of Covington, That it is hereby made the duty of the property holders holding property on Columbia street from Kirkland street to Rutland street, and on Gibson street from New Hampshire street to Columbia street, in the town of Covington, to build curbs, and make or repair the sidewalks in front of their property at their own expense.

That all curbs shall be of brick, laid in concrete, and all sidewalks or banquettes shall be made of cement and concrete, asphalt or brick.

That the Improvement Committee is hereby given the right to determine when it shall be necessary to cause the building of a new sidewalk or curbing in front of the property of any person who owns property on Columbia street, and in case the Improvement Committee or a majority of them, determine that it is necessary that a new sidewalk or curbing should be built or repaired, it shall be their duty to instruct the Marshal to notify the property holder, or owners, to build or repair his or her sidewalk, at his or her own expense within twenty days of the date of said notice, which must be given in writing, and in case the property holder, or owner, should neglect or refuse to make or repair, his or her sidewalk, or curbing, as above provided, then it shall be the duty of the Marshal to have such sidewalk or curbing built or repaired, at the expense of the owner or owners of the property along which it will stretch; and should the property owner refuse, or neglect, to pay the costs incurred for the material and labor as above provided, within ten days delay, to be counted from presentation of a bill, the amount of said expenses shall be recovered before any court of competent jurisdiction.

This Ordinance shall go into effect after thirty days publication in the official journal. All other Ordinances and resolutions on this same subject are hereby repealed. Adopted January 6, 1903. C. Z. WILLIAMS, Mayor. W. G. KENTZEL, Secretary.
