**Cotton Picking Under Difficulties.**  
 The very wet fall in Oklahoma delayed cotton picking and the cold weather following has made the gathering of the crop very difficult. Many farmers are getting around the difficulty by picking off the bolls containing the cotton and taking them to the house where the cotton is picked out in a warm room, often at night. The bolls can be picked or broken off with gloved hands, and this can be done when it is too cold for straight cotton picking. Some are separating the cotton from the bolls by running them through a common thrashing machine.
