## Crop Report

The U. S. Department of Agriculture Crop Bulletin reports as follows for the week ending June 21:

**Louisiana**—Warm, dry week, just as needed for killing grass and weeds; cotton generally clean and growing rapidly, fruiting well in some places but irregular in others; early corn maturing with good yield, late corn doing well; sugar cane in excellent state of cultivation and improving rapidly; early rice heading, crop generally promising; pear growing rapidly.


