

For Good Roads

If you sprinkle sulphur on your barn floor and through the corn as you gather, there will not be a rat or mouse bother. I have done this for several years, and have never been bothered with rats or mice. I have some old corn in the crib now and there is not a rat or mouse to be found. In stacking oats or wheat sprinkle on the ground and a little through each load, and my word for it, rats and mice can't stay there; and a pound of sulphur will be sufficient to preserve a large barn of corn, and the sulphur is good for stock and will not hurt the corn for bread.
