



Combination Planting of Cane, Potatoes and Pecans.

The farmers around Sorantou, Miss., are paying more attention than ever to the cultivation of sugar cane, and the cane crop of this year promises to be larger than ever before. Mr. I. P. Delmas, one of the largest planters, is building a sugar mill on his farm at Orange Grove, eight miles from Sorantou. He estimates the yield of cane this year at from seven to eight barrels of syrup per acre. His method of cultivating the cane on pine lands is unique, and is worthy of imitation. Between each row of cane is planted a row of potatoes, sweet or Irish. The cane gets the benefit of the fertilizers for the potatoes, and the same area of land yields a full crop of cane and a half crop of potatoes, netting \$100 per acre. In addition to this, every 50 feet is planted a paper shell pecan tree which, while growing, gets the benefit of the cane and potato cultivation, and in ten years the pecan grove will be worth \$1,000 per acre.
