Rotation.

No two crops should be grown on the same land two years in succession. Some plants root shallow, while others send their roots down deep into the earth; crops grow better after the land has been occupied by other crops; leguminous crops gather nitrogen from the air and place it in the soil to be used by succeeding crops, and insect pests are not so bad where rotation is practiced. Divide the farm into three fields during the winter, and number them 1, 2 and 3.

Next year plant cotton in No. 1, corn and peas in No. 2, and oats followed by peas in No. 3. The second year, plant oats followed by peas in No. 1, cotton in No. 2, corn and peas in No. 3. The third year, plant corn and peas in No. 1, oats followed by peas in No. 2, cotton in No. 3. By practicing this system of rotation the fertility of the soil will be maintained.—Farm Gazette.


