

Sharp Remanded Without Bail.

John Hugh Sharp, who is charged with the killing of Mathew Perry at Sandy Ford, in the Second Ward of this Parish, on Saturday, Dec. 15, had a preliminary trial here, Saturday, Dec. 19, before Judge Thomas M. Burns, and was remanded to jail without benefit of bail. Five witnesses for the State were examined. Sharp was represented by Attorney Duncan S. Kemp. District Attorney Gordon W. Goodbee, assisted by Attorney Lewis L. Morgan, appeared for the State. Sheriff Brewster took Sharp to the Parish Prison in New Orleans for safe keeping.

The Jastremski Address

General Jastremski's political supporters have at last succeeded in organizing a campaign committee and have issued an address in his behalf. The claim made for him was that he was the original advocate of primary elections for nominating candidates for public office in the State. This is a mistake, as is shown by the fact that the act of 1900 was passed by the General Assembly of Louisiana. The law was enacted in response to a long-cherished and repeatedly-expressed demand for some legislation that would surround with safeguards the nomination as well as the election of public officers. But the fact remains that when the General announced his candidacy he only declared himself in favor of what the law gave him.

Another one of his political virtues which is trumpeted in the address is that he declared himself in favor of stripping the Governor of all political patronage. It is difficult to see any special merit in this proposition. Should he be elected, he will not into office possessed of the patronage that pertained to his predecessors, and he will undoubtedly make prompt use of it.

General Jastremski is surrounded and followed by all the politicians who have any chance of being elected to a job, and he will be in duty bound to put them in public place as promptly as possible. Any failure to do this would load him with condemnation from his numerous retainers, and it is a foregone conclusion that he would, soon he should be inducted into office, set to work to turn out those who hold places from any previous administration and to fill up the offices with his own friends.

Should the Legislature undertake to deprive the Executive office of any of its patronage, it is not likely that the law would take effect until the expiration of the term of his appointment, and where any of the appointees are constitutionally appointed, a constitutional amendment ratified by the people would be necessary to make it authoritative.

There is, therefore, no danger that any appointees of General Jastremski would have any cause for fear from his savage determination to strip the Executive office of its power and patronage. He and his crew would enjoy it to the fullest extent, and the demagogic government would be left to his successors, since he cannot succeed himself.

Suppose it were made known that as soon as the Legislature can act after the next election, and that will be immediately, all appointive offices will be made elective and all appointments will be made as stated before the end of the year. Does anybody suppose that the politicians out-of-a-job would follow him another day? No; the grand pretension made by the General, that he does not want public patronage and would gladly give it up at the first opportunity, is too absurd to be for a moment credited. No man in public place wants to get rid of those prerogatives and privileges that add to the power and dignity of his administration.
