Propose to Develop Timber Holding

The party of capitalists who passed through Covington a few days ago have returned to their home in Buffalo, N. Y. A special dispatch from that city to the Times Democrat says:

The Goodyear brothers, with Geo. F. Field, Chas. J. Jones and a party of Northern capitalists, returned to Buffalo to-day after an extensive tour of railroad and timber land inspection to New Orleans and vicinity. The company owns 300,000 acres of fine land in the South, and the trip there was to negotiate with Southern contractors to improve certain lands with an idea of gaining access to other rich timber country contiguous to the Goodyear property. The company has already started negotiations for over 25,000 acres.

We have partly acquired other woodlands down there and will begin clearing them in a short time," said Charles Goodyear last night. "Possibly if the venture pans out right, we may run a line through there in order to handle the lumber. It is one of the wealthiest timber lands I ever saw."

"The outlook in the South exceeded our expectations, and in a short time there may be a line extending through our property."
