In an article on the settling of Northern people in the South, the New Orleans States says:

"No one is better pleased with the success of the northern settlers in the South than the Southern people themselves, because they know that it means much for their section, hence they desire that it should be generally known that the Northern farmers are prospering among them, because this knowledge will greatly increase the tide of immigration. The truth is that when a Northern farmer comes South to seek cheaper and more fertile land as well as a more genial climate he feels at home, because the South to-day is the only purely American section of the country by reason of the fact that the addition to its population of foreign people is so small as not to be noticeable."

And the Charleston News and Courier says:

"We do not fear any political disturbance in the South because of the settlement in this section of Northern colonies composed of such people. We do not care what their politics is, and how much they have been mistaken in their previous judgments of the South and its civilization; we know that they are assimilable, and that they will be moved in their aspirations and conduct by precisely the same spirit in essential things as has actuated always the white people of the South."
