Shall We Die Of Thirst.

After telling of the gradual dry-
ing up of the great lakes and rivers
all over the world in an article in
Chamber's Journal, J. B. Whitby
continues:

"Everywhere in our own coun-
try, as in others, water springs
are giving out and water beds dry-
ing up, slowly perhaps, but surely.
The increase of population and the
modern system of drainage have,
of course, a great deal to answer
for; but much of the drought is
undoubtedly caused by the rapid
destruction of timber on all sides,
for trees not only attract rain
clouds but preserve the moisture
of the soil. While it is impossible
for any man to control the geo-
logical period through which we
are passing, and whose charac-
teristic would be—according to some
—the gradual disappearance of
water, it may be inquired whether
it would not be advisable to post-
pone that disagreeable moment of
a world without water as far as
possible by the better preservation
of our woods and forests and the
persistent replanting of trees.

The Family as Poultry Raisers

If the farmer believes there is no
money in poultry, let him turn that
department over to the wife and
children, and give them what they
can make from it. Let him give
them a yard and a little portable
building to use, buy from a re-
sponsible breeder fowls or eggs of
the breed he likes best, and they
will astonish him by the money
they will make from a small begin-
ning, and what is more, it will
make them more contented to stay
on a farm when they see they can
have a show. They would make a
study of poultry raising in order to
get the best results from it.
Chickens bring per pound more
than twice the price of beef,
mutton or pork, are fit for market
in six months or less, and if well
taken care of, produce eggs a
great part of the year and can be,
by proper treatment, made to lay
in the fall and winter, when the
eggs are high. They cost but little
to feed, compared with stock of all
kinds. Why should they not be
profitable if properly cared for?
With an incubator the profits could
be still greater, as there would be
no need to buy fowls to start with.
A few settings of eggs would do
the business.
