PEITION FOR AN ELECTION IN AID OF THE BATON ROUGE, HAMMOND AND EASTERN RAILROAD.

To the Honorable, the Mayor and Council of the Town of Covington, State of Louisiana.
 We, the undersigned, representing more than one-third of the property tax payers legally qualified to vote within the Town of Covington, respectfully represent:
 That the construction by the Baton Rouge, Hammond and Eastern Railroad Company of a standard gauge railroad from the City of Baton Rouge, State of Louisiana, through the Parish of Livingston, into and through the Town of Hammond, Louisiana, and to the Town of Covington, would be of great value, advantage and benefit to the people and property within the Town of Covington.
 We therefore petition your honorable body to proceed according to law to submit to the property tax payers legally qualified to vote thereon a proposition to levy a tax, not to exceed five mills on the dollar per annum, on the assessed and assessable property in the Town of Covington, for the years 1907 to 1916, both inclusive, in aid of said Baton Rouge, Hammond and Eastern Railroad Company, a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Louisiana, and now domiciled in the City of Baton Rouge, in said State, and payable to the said Railroad Company, or order, its successors or assigns, provided that this tax shall be voted, levied and collected, on the following conditions, to-wit:
 First. That the said tax shall run for a period of ten years, as aforesaid, and shall not exceed the rate of five mills on the dollar, as aforesaid, it being the intention of the undersigned petitioners that the amount to be realized each year from the levy and collection of said tax shall not exceed the sum of twenty-five hundred dollars (\$2500).
 Second. That the said Baton Rouge, Hammond and Eastern Railroad Company, its successors or assigns, shall, within five months from the date of the voting of said tax, begin the construction of a standard gauge railroad from the City of Baton Rouge, State of Louisiana, through the Parish of Livingston, into and through the town of Hammond, and to the town of Covington, which said road is to be completed within eighteen months from the date of commencement thereof, it being understood that the periods herein above fixed, within which construction shall be begun and completed, are to prevail, unless the said Railroad Company be prevented by pestilence, wars, overflows, strikes, or other causes beyond its control, from beginning or completing the said construction, and that said subsidy or any part thereof, shall be payable to said Railroad Company, its successors or assigns, only when the said railroad shall have been constructed and put in operation.
 Third. That should the said Baton Rouge, Hammond and Eastern Railroad extend its line beyond the Town of Covington, or operate trains over other tracks beyond said town, that all passenger trains of said road shall stop at the town of Covington. And the said Railroad hereby agrees to build its depot within the corporate limits of the Town of Covington.

 On motion, duly seconded, the above petition was referred for examination and comparison with the Assessment Rolls of 1904, to a committee of three, consisting of E. J. Frederick, J. S. Jones and Dr. C. Z. Williams. After due consideration the committee returned and made the following report:
 To the honorable Mayor and Board of Aldermen—We, your committee appointed at a meeting of the Town Council on the fourth day of October, 1905, for the purpose of examining and comparing with the assessment roll for the year 1904 the petition of the property holders for an election in aid of the Baton Rouge, Hammond and Eastern Railroad Company, beg to report that we find more than one-third of the property tax payers of the Town of Covington have signed this petition and make the following statement of results:
 Total number of those entitled to vote on Assessment roll of 1904, who are registered 80
 Total number of signers 142, of which number the qualified electors under Act 202 of 1898, are 47
 Total number of signers entitled to vote 89
 Of the above, 42 are women whose names appear on the assessment roll of 1904, and who are thereby eligible to vote.

 On motion, duly seconded, the above report was adopted by a unanimous vote.
 The following Ordinance was then read:

AN ORDINANCE

Ordering a special election at which shall be submitted to the property tax payers of the town of Covington entitled to vote under the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana the question of levying a special tax in aid of the Baton Rouge, Hammond and Eastern Railroad Company, its successors or assigns for a period of ten years, beginning with the year 1907, and ending with the year 1916, of five mills on the dollar annually, or as much thereof as may be necessary to raise the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500 00) for and in each of said years, or so much as said tax of five mills on the dollar per annum on all taxable property of said town will produce in accordance with the petition of the tax payers and electors of said town hereto annexed and made part hereof, and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in said petition.
 Section I. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Covington, in legal session convened, That a special election be held in said town on the 14th day of November, 1905, between the legal hours, at which the question of levying a special tax of five mills on the dollar per annum for a period of ten years, from the year 1907 to the year 1916, both inclusive, or as much thereof as may be necessary to raise the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500 00) for each of said years, or such sum, not exceeding two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500 00) per annum, as said tax of five mills on the dollar will produce, in aid of the Baton Rouge, Hammond and Eastern Railroad Company, a Corporation created under the laws of the State of Louisiana, its successors or assigns, shall be submitted to the property tax payers of said town of Covington who are entitled to vote at said election under the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, subject to the terms and conditions of the petition of the tax payers mentioned in the title hereof and hereto annexed.
 Section II. Be it further ordained, etc., That said special election shall be held under the election laws of this State at the polling place or places established by law for holding elections in said town, and the ballots to be used at said election shall be in the following form, to-wit:
 For special tax of five mills on the dollar annually, for a period of ten years commencing with the year 1907, in aid of the Baton Rouge, Hammond and Eastern Railroad Company, its successors or assigns, the amount to be realized from said tax not to exceed the sum of twenty five hundred dollars (\$2500 00) in any one of said years.
 Sec. III. Be it further ordained, etc., That the Board of Supervisors of Election of the Parish of St. Tammany, are hereby requested to appoint commissioners and clerk to serve at said polling place or places established by law in aid of the Baton Rouge, Hammond and Eastern Railroad Company, and to make their return of said election to the Mayor and Council of the town of Covington, who shall announce and promulgate the result of said election according to law.
 Sec. IV. Be it further ordained, etc., That the commissioners of election shall receive the ballots of all the property tax payers of said town entitled to vote under the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, and the voters at said election, before depositing their ballots in the ballot box, shall endorse their names on the back of said ballots together with the aggregate amount of property situated in the town of Covington for which they are voting for the year 1905, and the said commissioners in making the returns of said election shall state the number of votes and the amount of the assessed value of property voting for and against the levy of said special tax.
 Sec. V. Be it further ordained, etc., That this ordinance and the annexed petition of the tax payers of said town of Covington be published in the official journal of said town for thirty full clear days previous to the date of holding said election, and that this ordinance, for good and sufficient reason, take effect from and after its passage.


