CHARTER
 OF THE
 COVINGTON ICE AND COLD STORAGE COMPANY, LIMITED.
 United States of America,
 Parish of St. Tammany,
 State of Louisiana.
 Be it known, that on the seventh day of November, 1905, and of the Independence of the United States of America the one hundred and thirtieth.
 Before me, Joseph B. Lanester, a Notary Public, duly commissioned and sworn, in and for the Parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned, personally came and appeared the parties whose names are hereunto subscribed, all of full age, who declare that, availing themselves of the provisions of the laws relative to the organization of corporations for manufacturing, and for other purposes, especially the provisions of Act No. 78 of 1904, they have covenanted and agreed, and by these presents do covenant and agree and bind themselves, as such other persons as may hereafter be constituted a corporation, to form and constitute a corporation and a body politic in law, for the purpose and objects, and under the rules and regulations and conditions following, to wit:

ARTICLE I.
 The name and style of this corporation shall be The Covington Ice and Cold Storage Company, Limited, and by this name it shall have power and authority to exist and enjoy succession for the full term and period of ninety-nine years from date hereof, unless sooner dissolved.
ARTICLE II.
 The domicile of this corporation shall be in the Town of Covington, St. Tammany Parish, State of Louisiana. All citations and other legal process shall be served upon the President, or in case of his absence or inability to act, upon the Vice President, and in the absence or inability to act of both, then upon the Secretary. The President shall be the executive officer of the corporation, and shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors and stockholders.
ARTICLE III.
 The objects and purposes for which this corporation is established, and the nature of the business to be carried on by it, are hereby declared to be:
 First. To buy, own, sell, construct, lease and operate plants for the production of ice, and to supply water, and distilled water, either wholesale or retail.
 Second. To produce, furnish, supply and distribute electricity for light, heat, power, and any and all other purposes for which it may be necessary, and to buy, own, sell, construct, lease and operate power houses, plants, poles, lines, and wires and cables for the above purposes.
 Third. To buy, own, sell, lease, construct and operate waterworks, plants and pipes, and to supply water for public or private purposes, to political corporations or to individuals.
 Fourth. To buy, own, sell, lease and operate plants, pipes and systems for manufacture and distribution and sale of gas for all purposes.
 Fifth. To buy, sell, lease, own, hold and vote shares of stock or bonds or securities of any of these corporations engaged only in any of the above branches of business or to sell, mortgage, pledge, lease or otherwise dispose of or encumber the property, real, personal or mixed, of the corporation or the products thereof, and to do all and any acts and things which may be necessary or proper to carry out the objects of this corporation.
ARTICLE IV.
 This corporation may sue and be sued in its corporate name; make and use a corporate seal, to break or alter at pleasure; hold, have, receive, purchase, convey, sell, mortgage, hypothecate, pledge, lease, sublease and enjoy real, personal and mixed property; also borrow and lend money and make contracts; make and establish such by-laws, rules and regulations as shall be necessary, and at the same time alter and change at pleasure; and shall possess all the rights and privileges to which corporations are now or may hereafter be authorized and entitled to possess. This corporation may exercise its corporate power within any other State or Territory of this Union.
ARTICLE V.
 The capital stock of said corporation shall be thirty thousand dollars, divided into and represented by six hundred shares of the value of fifty dollars each, which said stock shall be paid for in cash at the time or times or in the manner as may be deemed proper by the Board of Directors, or the same may be issued at not less than par, in payment or exchange for property or rights actually received or purchased by said corporation, or the same may be issued for money advanced and for such other valuable consideration or services as the Board of Directors of said corporation may determine; provided no stock shall be issued until consideration therefor has been received by said corporation. Said shares of stock shall be signed by the President and Secretary. At all elections by or meetings of the stockholders

each share of stock shall be entitled to one vote, to be cast by the person in whose name the stock appears on the books of the corporation, or by his agent or proxy duly authorized to that effect in writing.
 This corporation shall commence business and become a going concern as soon as one hundred shares of its capital stock shall have been subscribed and at least five thousand dollars of the capital stock fully paid in.
ARTICLE VI.
 No stockholder shall have authority or right to sell or otherwise dispose of his stock, in whole or in part, without first giving to the Board of Directors fifteen days notice in writing of his intention or desire to dispose of his stock, or any part thereof, and allowing the Board of Directors, or in its default any stockholder, the first opportunity of purchasing the stock, after which fifteen days the said stock may be sold in open market. The stock of said corporation may be transferred under the above conditions, provided such transfer thereof be made on the books of the corporation, at its domicile in Covington, this parish and State, and upon the surrender of the certificate therefor.
ARTICLE VII.
 The business affairs and corporate powers of this corporation shall be transacted by a Board of Directors, to be composed of nine stockholders. A majority of said Board shall constitute a quorum, but a less number shall have a right to adjourn at a given date. No person shall be eligible as a director or officer, as herein provided in this charter, who is not a stockholder of this corporation. The members of the Board of Directors shall be elected by a majority of the votes of the stockholders at a meeting to be held for that purpose. The following persons shall constitute the first Board of Directors: H. B. Daboval, H. J. Smith, W. A. Dutsch, H. H. Smith, Leopold Levy, Louis Bonin, John B. Kent, M. J. Sellar and F. Portune. Said Board shall continue in office until January 15, 1907, on which date, and annually thereafter, an election for directors shall be held at the office of the corporation, after fifteen days notice thereof shall have been given by publication in one of the newspapers published in the Parish of St. Tammany, by two publications thereof, during said time. A failure to elect directors on the date above mentioned shall not dissolve this corporation, but the then Board of Directors shall continue to hold office, and another election shall be held as soon thereafter as practicable, of which notice shall be given in the manner already provided in this article. After the election of the Board of Directors, they shall immediately elect, from among their own number, a President, a Vice President, and a Treasurer, who shall also be Secretary. The officers, as herein created, shall be filled by the following named persons, and who shall serve as such from the present time until a new Board of Directors are elected at the meeting to be held January 15, 1907: H. B. Daboval, President; H. J. Smith, Vice President, and H. H. Smith, Secretary and Treasurer.
ARTICLE VIII.
 Any vacancy occurring in the Board of Directors from any cause shall be filled by the remaining members of the Board from among the stockholders of the Corporation. The Board of Directors shall make such by-laws, rules and regulations as they may deem necessary, and change and alter the same at pleasure, name and appoint all managers, employees or other officers, and fix their salaries, term of service, with the right to dismiss them at said Board's pleasure, and the said Board shall have the right to fix and determine the salaries and duties of the several officers herein created by this charter, and to exercise other duties to said officers as will best serve the interest and welfare of the Corporation. They shall also have the power to sell, convey, mortgage, pledge, lease, sublease and purchase property, movable and immovable, personal and mixed; borrow money, notes and bonds; make contracts and do all things which may be necessary to properly transact and manage the business of this Corporation.
ARTICLE IX.
 This act of incorporation may be changed, modified or amended, or said Corporation may be dissolved, with the assent of the majority of the amount of stock present or represented at any general meeting of the stockholders of said Corporation convened for such purpose, after thirty (30) days previous notice of such meeting shall have been given by publication in one of the newspapers published in the Parish of St. Tammany, by four publications of said notice during said time. Whenever notice of such meeting is dissolved, either by limitation or from other cause, its affairs shall be liquidated under the superintendence of three commissioners chosen for that purpose from among the stockholders, by a majority in amount of the stockholders present or represented at a general meeting of the stockholders, as above set forth in this Article. The said commissioners shall remain in office until the affairs of the Corporation shall have been fully liquidated. Should a vacancy occur in said commissioners, the survivor or survivors shall continue to act.
ARTICLE X.
 No stockholder of this Corporation shall be held liable or responsible for the contracts or debts thereof in any further amount than the unpaid balance due the Corporation on the shares subscribed for or owned by him; nor shall any informality in organization have the effect of rendering this charter null, or exposing a stockholder to any liability beyond the unpaid balance, if any, of his stock.
 Thus done and passed at my notarial office, in the Town of Covington, Parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, on the 16th day of month and year herein first above written, in the presence of W. B. Cowart and Wiley M. Wood, two competent witnesses of lawful age, and residents of said town, parish and State, who hereunto sign their names, together with said applicants and me, notary, after due reading of the aforesaid.
