CHARTER
OF THE
Tchoufucta River Packet Com-
pany, Limited.

UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,
 STATE OF LOUISIANA, PARISH
 OF ST. TAMMANY, TOWN OF
 COVINGTON.

Be it known, That on this 13th day of March, in the year of our Lord, one thousand, nine hundred and six, and of the independence of the United States of America the one hundred and thirtieth, before me, Benj. M. Miller a notary public, duly commissioned and sworn, in and for the parish and town aforesaid, therein reading, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned, personally came and appeared Harrie U. Hayden, of lawful age, residing at Pineland Park, in the parish of St. Tammany, in this State; Ernest C. Duncan, of lawful age, residing also at said Pineland Park; Lewis L. Morgan, of lawful age, a resident of the town of Covington; Charles Jenkins, of lawful age, of this town of Covington; Claiborne F. Stanga, of lawful age, a resident of Madisonville, this parish; Louis F. Young, of lawful age, of Madisonville, this parish; and Albert C. Bosse, of lawful age, of Madisonville, this parish; which said witnesses severally declared that, availing themselves of the laws of the State of Louisiana relative to the organization of corporations, they have covenanted and agreed, and do by these presents covenant and agree, and bind themselves, as well as all other persons who may hereafter become associated with them, to form and constitute a corporation and body politic in law, under the following stipulations and articles, which they hereby adopt as their charter, to-wit:

ARTICLE I.
 The name and style of this corporation shall be the Tchoufucta River Packet Company, Limited, and under its corporate name it shall have the right of succession for the full term and period of ninety-nine (99) years from the date of these presents.

ARTICLE II.
 The domicile of this corporation shall be in the town of Covington, parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, and all citations or other legal processes shall be served upon the President, in his absence, upon the Vice President or upon the Secretary of this corporation; and this corporation shall have, enjoy and exercise all the rights, actions, powers, privileges and immunities granted by the laws of the State of Louisiana to corporations, and to acquire, purchase, movable and immovable, necessary for the carrying out of its objects and purposes, and to pay for the same in cash or full paid stock of this corporation, as may be determined by its Board of Directors.

ARTICLE III.
 The objects and purposes for which this corporation is organized, and the nature of the business to be carried on by it, are hereby declared to be to acquire, own, maintain or operate boats, by steam or other machine power, for the transportation of passengers and freight from the town of Covington to Madisonville, Madisonville, Pineland Park, New Orleans and other ports or landings in the said parish of St. Tammany; to engage in the business of carrying freight and passengers for hire; and generally to act as common carriers; to acquire, dock, facilities; movable and immovable, necessary for the carrying out of its objects and purposes of this corporation, as may be determined by the Board of Directors; and generally to do and perform any and all things necessary to carry out the objects and purposes of this corporation.

ARTICLE IV.
 The capital stock of this corporation is hereby fixed at thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) divided into fifteen hundred (1500) shares, of par value of twenty dollars (\$20.00) each, to be paid cash at the time of subscription, and ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) of the capital stock of this corporation having been subscribed and paid in, this corporation shall commence business immediately, and the said stock shall be transferred upon the books of this corporation only upon surrender or proof of loss or destruction of the outstanding certificates.

ARTICLE V.
 All the powers of this corporation shall be vested in and exercised by a Board of Directors, to be composed of seven (7) stockholders, four (4) of whom shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of all the business of this corporation, and the following stockholders shall compose the first Board of Directors of this corporation, and shall hold their office until the first Monday in March, 1907, or until their successors are elected and have qualified, to-wit: Harrie U. Hayden, Ernest C. Duncan, Lewis L. Morgan, Charles Jenkins, Claiborne F. Stanga, Louis F. Young and Albert C. Bosse, with Harrie U. Hayden as President, and Ernest C. Duncan as Secretary and Treasurer.

ARTICLE VI.
 The Board of Directors shall be elected annually on the first Monday in March of each year. All such elections shall be by ballot and held at the office of the corporation under the supervision of three (3) commissioners, to be appointed by the Board of Directors; notice of such election shall be given by publication, not less than ten days prior to such election, in one of the newspapers published in the town of Covington, parish of St. Tammany. Every stockholder shall be entitled to one (1) vote for each share of stock standing in his name on the books of this corporation, to be cast in person or by proxy, and the majority of the votes cast shall elect.
 The Board of Directors, except the Board herein appointed, shall annually, at its first meeting, elect from its own number a President, a Vice President, a Secretary and a Treasurer, who shall hold office for one (1) year, or until their successors shall be elected and qualified.
 The Board of Directors shall fix the salaries of all of the officers, and shall have the right to make, as well as alter

or amend, any and all rules, regulations and by-laws which they may deem necessary for the management of the affairs of this corporation.

ARTICLE VII.
 Whenever this corporation shall be dissolved by limitation, or from any other cause, its affairs shall be liquidated by three (3) commissioners elected by the stockholders at a general meeting, to be convened for that purpose, by publication not less than ten (10) days prior to the said meeting, in one of the newspapers published in the town of Covington, parish of St. Tammany, and a majority of the votes cast shall elect. Said commissioners shall remain in office until the affairs of this corporation shall have been fully liquidated.
 In case of the death of one or more of said commissioners, or of any vacancy occurring among them from any other cause, the vacancy shall be filled by the remaining commissioners from among the stockholders.

ARTICLE VIII.
 This act of incorporation may be changed, altered or amended, and this corporation may be dissolved, by the assent of three-fourths (3/4) of the amount of the capital stock given at a general meeting of the stockholders convened for that purpose, after notice thereof shall have been published for not less than fifteen (15) days in one of the newspapers published in the town of Covington.
 The capital stock may be increased or decreased in accordance with the laws of the State of Louisiana.

ARTICLE IX.
 No stockholder shall be held liable for the contracts, debts or liabilities or failure of this corporation in any further sum than the unpaid balance due this corporation on the shares of stock owned by him, nor shall any informally in the organization have the effect of rendering this charter null, or of exposing any stockholder to any liability beyond the unpaid balance due on his stock.

ARTICLE X.
 Any vacancy occurring in the Board of Directors shall be filled by the remaining directors, and a failure to elect directors on the day above specified shall not dissolve this corporation, but the directors then in office shall continue in office until their successors are elected and have qualified, and shall cause another election to be held as soon as possible thereafter, after notice shall have been published as herein above stipulated.
