Woodmen Monument Unveiling.

The members of Holly Camp, Woodmen of the World, with a large representation of Woodmen from Louisiana and Mississippi last Sunday unveiled the monument at the grave of Sovereign A. R. Courtney, who died in Covington last summer. The train from New Orleans had a special coach bearing the four New Orleans companies of the uniformed rank, and large delegations from several towns along the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad. A special train from Folsom brought camps from Folsom, Franklinton, Knon and other points. The camp at Madisonville came across the country in carriages.

The visiting delegations marched to Castle Hall, where lunch was served, and the visitors enjoyed a brief rest. The procession was formed for the march to the Cemetery in the following order: Sovereign Jas. A. Alpointe, Grand Marshal; Wolf's Band, New Orleans; St. Tammany Rangers; State National Guard; the four uniformed companies of Woodmen from New Orleans; the camps from Hattiesburg, Picaune and several small camps from neighboring towns; camps from Folsom, Madisonville and Covington.

The exercises at the cemetery were conducted according to the ritual of the order, and were most impressive, in a strong and picturesque way bringing out the teachings of the order.

The beautiful marble shaft was unveiled and dedicated by Hattiesburg Camp No. 149, of which Mr. Courtney was a member, and after music by a choir, Past Head Commander A. B. Booth delivered an impressive oration. His theme was fraternity and what it meant to the average man.

After the exercises at the cemetery the camps marched back to Castle Hall, where they listened to an address by Council Commander R. P. Anderson of the Hattiesburg camp on the life and character of Sovereign Courtney. He also expressed his thanks for the attention to the memory of their deceased brother and thanked the various camps for attending.

The following camps were present: New Orleans, Palmetto No. 2, Acorn No. 57, Hickory No. 28 and Live Oak No. 53; Elm Camp No. 286, Folsom; Raon Camp, Knon, La.; Leaf River Camp and Hattiesburg Camp, from Hattiesburg, Miss.; Picaune Camp, from Picaune, Miss.; Franklinton Camp, from Franklinton, La.; Madisonville Camp and Holly Camp of this place. L. P. Delcroix, council commander of the local camp, had full management of the exercises, and was assisted by the chairmen of the various committees and officers of the lodge.

The crowd at the cemetery was the largest ever seen here on any similar occasion.

An Unusual Treat.

On Easter Monday the new Lutheran Church, at Abita Springs, will be dedicated, and a special train will be run from New Orleans for the occasion. Services will be held at 11:30 A. M. and 3:30 P. M. The people of Covington and vicinity are cordially invited to attend.

LICENSE ORDINANCE

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Town Council of the town of Covington, La., That a license tax be and is hereby levied for the year 1906 upon each person, corporation, firm or association pursuing any calling, trade, profession or doing any business in the limits of the town of Covington, La., except those who are expressly exempt from such license tax by Act 229 of the Constitution.

Sec. 2. Be it further ordained, etc., That the amount of license tax for the town of Covington for such trade, occupation, vocation, business or calling subject to license by Act 229 of the Constitution and by Act 171 of the General Assembly of 1898 shall pay in the same manner as licenses due the State; and in the event that same are not paid when due, it is ordered that the Tax Collector for the town of Covington shall place said license tax, when due and unpaid, in the hands of the town Attorney, who is hereby authorized and instructed to immediately thereafter institute legal proceedings to enforce the payment of same.

Sec. 3. Be it further ordained, etc., That the licenses due the town of Covington shall be and are hereby due and collectible at the same time and in the same manner as licenses due the State; and in the event that same are not paid when due, it is ordered that the Tax Collector for the town of Covington shall place said license tax, when due and unpaid, in the hands of the town Attorney, who is hereby authorized and instructed to immediately thereafter institute legal proceedings to enforce the payment of same.
