Total number of votes cast in favor of the levy of said special tax 209; total number cast against the levy of said special tax 36. Total amount in value of the property cast in favor of the levy of said special tax, \$294,645.00; total amount in value of property cast against the levy of said special tax \$46,782.00. Majority in number of property taxpayers, in favor of said levy of special tax 173; majority in value of property taxpayers in favor of said levy of special tax \$147,893.00.
