this afternoon, five vestibuled Pullmans being precipitated twenty-five feet to the bed of the Creek, which was nearly dry, one of the Pullmans being torn assunder. Two hundred passengers went down with the coaches.

Third—To amend Article 5 of the Charter by increasing the capital stock of the corporation from twenty thousand (\$20,000) dollars, represented by four hundred shares of the par value of fifty dollars each (as at present) to the sum of one hundred thousand (\$100,000) dollars, to be represented by two thousand shares of the par value of fifty dollars each.


