

**COVINGTON BANK AND TRUST CO.**

Opens Up Its New Bank Building and Throws Open Its Doors.

Large Crowds Take Advantage of Opportunity to Inspect It.

Last Wednesday, September 2, 1908, the Covington Bank and Trust Company opened up business in their new bank building on the corner of Columbia and Boston streets. This handsome structure, a photograph of which is published herein, was crowded with visitors Wednesday, both patrons and

friends of the bank, who inspected its handsome fittings and convenient arrangements for the transaction of business. Many ladies were among the visitors, and beautiful bouquets of flowers were received from the bank's admirers, among the prettiest being one of assorted flowers sent by Mrs. Charles Theiry. Punch was served to the guests and all courtesy and attention extended to them to make their visit one of pleasure and instruction.

Dr. C. Z. Williams, Hon. S. D. Bulloch, Joseph Delery, Dr. N. M. Hebert, Hon. E. P. Singletary and Hon. H. R. Warren assisted in entertaining the guests.

Since the organization of the bank, June 6, 1898, the capital stock has been increased from \$15,000 to \$100,000, and it now has a surplus of \$45,000, and the stockholders have received 188 1-2 per cent.

This is the second structure that has been built by this company, and was made necessary by the rapid increase in business and the necessity for greater facility in handling it.

The building is two stories, built of grey pressed brick, trimmed in terra cotta, with fine provision for light and ventilation, and is heated throughout by steam, each room having a toilet and lavatory and being supplied with fine water.

On the first floor, back of the banking room and opening on Boston street, with large plate glass front, is the storeroom.

On the second floor there is room for four to eight offices. Dr. M. R. Fisher and Dr. A. Peyroux, Jr., dentists, K. H. Barrow, civil engineer, have offices on this floor. The entire

ceiling is of steel and is set off by the handsome moldings of the cornice that caps the tinted walls.

The President's room and the Director's room are both fitted up with handsome mahogany furniture, whose polished and mirror-like surface is ungarished by ornamentation of any kind, giving an inexpressible tone of richness to the surroundings. The banking room is likewise furnished.

The vault is built in the latest style of architecture, with ventilation and approved methods of protection from fire. Within this vault is the improve Mosler safe, with its time lock. The vault is entered from the rear of the banking room. The vault also contains the seventy deposit boxes that are rented for individual use. These boxes are reached from the Boston street entrance as well as from the banking room.

The floor is of tile, design being a small, very effective pattern of circles. The counters are of mahogany and Italian white marble, and the facing or frontage of the counters is of the same Italian marble. The wainscoting surrounding the wall of the banking room is likewise of English vein Italian white marble on a base of Verde antique marble.

The high wall of bronze grill-work that encloses the counters and windows of the Paying and Receiving tel-




