SIMPSON BRANCH IMPROVEMENT.

One of the most important undertakings of the town authorities is the clearing out of Simpson Branch, with a view to perfecting it as a drainage Canal. To eliminate its natural defects its numerous abrupt curves are being straightened by digging transverse canals about eight feet wide, thus giving a more direct flow to its outlet.




