The Police Jury met in regular session on Monday, February 8, 1909. All members present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read. On motion, duly seconded, the minutes of the previous meeting were adopted as read.

It was moved and seconded that Mr. J. J. Cusachs be authorized to have the road machine that is now in the third ward, transferred to the seventh ward.

Carried. Moved and seconded that the contract now with Mr. Eugene Mugnier, to operate a ferry between Madisonville and Houltonville, be renewed for four years.

Carried. Moved and seconded that a committee be appointed to locate a bridge right below the 3 mile still in the 3rd ward.

The President appointed the following members as a committee to locate a site for the above mentioned bridge: H. Schultz, Crawford Williams and Mark Fitzgerald.

The President appointed a committee of two, consisting of Geo. Bierhorst and Herman Schultz, to act with himself to inspect the washout at Tehefuncta bridge, and to recommend ways and means of having same fixed.


