LICENSE ORDINANCE
Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Covington, La., in legal session convened at the time and place and is hereby levied for the year 1910 on each person, occupation, firm or association pursuing any occupation, business or calling, in the town of Covington, La., which is subject to a license, to wit:

Sec. 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that the amount of license due this town for each occupation, business, trade, or calling carried on or conducted in this town, subject to a license, is hereby fixed at the same as is now levied and collected by the State for such occupation, business, trade or calling, within the corporate limits of this town except the liquor licenses which shall be five hundred dollars (\$500) for the year 1910.
Sec. 3. Be it further ordained, etc., that the licenses due this town shall be and are hereby due and collectible at the same time and place as are the licenses due the State, and in the event the same are not paid when due, it is ordered that the tax collector report the same to the town attorney, who is hereby authorized and instructed to forthwith institute legal proceedings to enforce payment of same.
It was moved by J. Seiler, seconded by P. J. Lacroix that above ordinance be adopted.
