Washington, Sept. 24.—The cultivation of rice, which forms the principal food of one-half of the population of the earth, and which, when combined with legumes (beans, peas, etc.), is a much cheaper complete food ration than wheat and meat, has a bright future in the South Atlantic and Gulf States, according to Dr. S. A. Knapp, of the Department of Agriculture.
