LOCUST IS COMING

Two Giant Broods Are Due Within Short Time.

Plea to Be Made for Birds That They May Help in the Work of Destroying Them—Render the Greatest Service.

To warn farmers and orchardists against the resurrection of the "seven-year locust" or "periodical cicada" that will occur in certain areas of this country next spring, a call for preserving the wild birds that destroy this pest is being issued from the headquarters of the National Association of Audubon Societies, says Houston Post.

English sparrows, robins, woodpeckers, orioles, scarlet tanagers, cuckoos, gold-finches and nuthatches have been proved by the government biological survey to have rendered the greatest service in devouring these periodical cicada on their last raids of the country, according to the records that have been searched by the Audubon workers.

Shielded in tin shells, the periodical cicada are today preparing to burst forth in countless multitudes over the fields of both north and south, the entomological experts declare. Unnumbered hosts of these world insects will next summer sit young trees and deposit to blight their tender sprouts the eggs that will bring forth the species seventeen years hence.

Comprehensive state laws for the protection of the insect-eating birds and widespread efforts to shelter and feed them through the storms of next winter are advocated in this emergency by the National Association of Audubon Societies, which has for years urged the people of America to consider such problems from the economic standpoint.

"The fear of the locust plague that is now spreading over the agricultural sections only points sharply the moral of our general campaign," said William Dutcher, president of the National Association of Audubon Societies at its headquarters, 141 Broadway.

Corn Grain for Horses. Corn grain when ground into meal is by far too concentrated to feed alone to horses.

The better way to feed corn is to grind it with oats, two parts oats to one of corn, and grind the corn and mix coarse wheat bran with it equally.

Soil for Flower Beds. In preparing beds for the flowers it should be remembered that most flowers which produce a yellow bloom should not have much organic matter in the soil.

Swine Plague. Be sure that cholera or swine plague is about before getting started out of your young hogs. Many a scorch scare has come from new corn sickness or indigestion.



Device Illustrated for Converting Reciprocating Motion Into Rotary—Easily Erected.

A device for converting a reciprocating motion of the windmill into a rotary motion is shown in the illustrations, writes Geo. Gilbert in Farm and Home. Drawing No. 1 shows the windmill rod at center of stroke.




