**AMENDMENT TO CHARTER.**

State of Louisiana, Parish of St. Tammany.

Be it known, that on this, the 11th day of January, 1911, before me, Lewis L. Morgan, a notary public in and for the parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned, personally came and appeared first, H. J. Smith, president, and Thos. M. Burns, secretary, of the Peoples' Building and Loan Association, who declared that a general meeting of the stockholders of the said Peoples' Building and Loan Association was convened at their office in the town of Covington, La., on the 3d day of January, 1911, after due notice of said meeting had been given publication in the St. Tammany Farmer, a newspaper published in the parish of St. Tammany, La., for and during ten (10) consecutive days preceding said meeting; that notice set out the said purpose and object of said meeting; that the same had been called to determine whether or not the charter of said corporation should be amended by reducing the number of board of directors of said corporation from eleven (11) stockholders to seven (7) stockholders. That on the above date, the meeting convened and there was present or represented more than two-thirds of the capital stock of said corporation, and by a vote of more than two-thirds of the capital stock, Article V of this charter of the said Peoples' Building and Loan Association, was amended so as to read as follows:

**ARTICLE V.**

All the powers of this corporation shall be exercised by a board of directors composed of seven stockholders; said directors to be elected at a general meeting convened for that purpose on the first Tuesday of January, each year, commencing on the first Tuesday in January, 1912; notice of such meeting shall be published in a newspaper of St. Tammany and Washington Parishes, for the space of ten days immediately preceding said election; the election shall be by ballot at the domicile of this corporation under the supervision of three commissioners, stockholders appointed by the board of directors at the last preceding meeting; each share of stock is entitled to one vote, and the stockholders receiving a majority of the votes cast shall be elected; failure to hold an election on the day specified shall not dissolve this corporation, but the directors in office shall hold power until an election be held after ten days notice of the time and place thereof; the directors shall elect from their number a president and a vice president; a majority of the directors shall be a quorum for the transaction of business; all vacancies shall be filled by the remaining members of said board of directors; the directors shall select and appoint a secretary, a treasurer, an attorney and a notary and such other officers as shall be necessary, but no salary shall be paid except to the secretary; the directors shall have power to make by-laws, to select a place of meeting, to suspend any and all officers; and have general authority to carry out the objects and business of the association, but they shall not have power to purchase real estate except for cash, nor contract any indebtedness in excess of amount of cash on hand. The following named persons shall constitute the board of directors to serve until the regular meeting in January, 1912, or until their successors are elected, to-wit: H. J. Smith, J. S. Jones, M. P. Planche, Gaston Galmiche, Thos. M. Burns, C. V. Guave and Paul J. Laborde.


