ORDINANCE.

An ordinance imposing a street tax for the maintenance of streets and bridges within the corporate limits of the Village of Pearl River, providing for its enforcement by fine or imprisonment.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Village of Pearl River:

Section 1. That all able bodied persons between the ages of 18 and 55 years, residing within the limits of the Village of Pearl River shall be required to work the Village streets not to exceed four (4) days in each year, when notified by the marshal or street commissioner, provided that any persons may relieve himself from such compulsory street duty by paying a street tax in lieu thereof, which is hereby fixed at two (2) dollars.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall not apply to transients or persons not residing within the village.

Be it further ordained, etc.:

Section 3. That any person failing to report for street work after being duly notified by the marshal or street commissioner, and who fails to pay the amount in lieu of said street work, as provided in section 1 of this ordinance, shall be arrested and after trial and conviction before the mayor's court shall be condemned to pay a fine not to exceed five (5) dollars and in default of payment of said fine, he worked on the streets of the village for not more than ten days.

Be it further ordained, etc.:

Section 4. That all ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed, and that this ordinance shall be effective from and after its promulgation.

RESOLUTION.

Calling a special election, to be held in the town of Covington, La., for the purpose of submitting to the voters, taxpayers of said town, the proposition as to whether or not they will incur debt and issue negotiable bonds therefor, the object of which the debt is to be incurred to erect and construct a public school house within the town of Covington, La., in regular session convened. That a special election be called, and the same is hereby called, to be held within the corporate limits of the town of Covington, for the purpose of submitting to the property taxpayers, authorized to vote at such elections, under the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, the proposition, as to whether or not they will incur debt to the sum and amount of eighteen thousand dollars, and issue negotiable bonds therefor, the object of which the debt is to be incurred to erect and construct a public school house within the town of Covington, La., the title to which shall be vested in the public; that the bonds to be issued therefor, the negotiable bonds to be issued therefor, shall run for a period of six years, commencing with the year 1911, and bear interest thereon at the rate of five per centum per annum; interest to be payable annually.
