Charter of

THE NEW SOUTHERN HOTEL CO. United States of America, State of Louisiana, Parish of St. Tammany.

Be it known, that on this 15th day of February, in the year of our Lord, one thousand, nine hundred and eleven, and of the Independence of the United States of America the one hundred and thirty-fifth, before me, Lewis L. Morgan, a notary public, duly commissioned and qualified, in and for the parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned, personally came and appeared the persons whose names are hereunto subscribed, all of full age, who severally declared that, availing themselves of the provisions of the laws of the State, relative to corporations and their organization, they have covenanted and agreed, and by these presents do covenant and agree and bind themselves, as well as such other persons as may hereafter become associated with them, to form and constitute a corporation, and body politic in law, for the objects and purposes and under the stipulations, articles and conditions, following, to-wit:

ARTICLE I. The name and style of this corporation shall be THE NEW SOUTHERN HOTEL COMPANY, and its domicile is hereby established at Covington, in St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana, and under its corporate name said corporation shall have power and authority to contract, sue and be sued; to make and use a corporate seal, and the same to break or alter at pleasure; to receive, hold, have, purchase, improve, alienate, convey, borrow, mortgage and hypothecate, under its said corporate name, property, real, personal

and mixed; to name and appoint such managers, agents, directors and officers as its business, interests and convenience may require; to make and establish such by-laws, rules and regulations for the proper management and regulation of its affairs as may be deemed necessary and proper to carry out the objects and purposes of said corporation. Said corporation, unless sooner dissolved, in accordance with its charter, shall exist or continue for the period of ninety-nine years from and after the date hereof. The president, or in his absence, the vice president, or in the absence of both, the secretary shall be the proper person upon whom citation or other legal process shall be served.

ARTICLE II.

The objects and purposes for which this corporation is formed and the nature of the business to be carried on by it, are hereby declared to be: The operation of a hotel in all of its branches; the leasing or letting of same in whole or in part for hotel, or commercial purposes, or otherwise; the manufacture of ice, electricity and the production of water for the use of said hotel, with the right to sell said ice, electricity or water to the general public; to purchase for cash or on terms of credit, such lands or buildings, or to cause such buildings to be erected, as shall be necessary to the conduct of the aforesaid business, and generally to do all things incidental to the proper management or control of said business.

ARTICLE III.

The capital stock of this corporation is hereby fixed at fifty thousand (\$50,000.00) dollars, divided into and represented by five hundred (500) shares of the par value of one hundred (\$100.00) dollars each, which stock may be issued at less than par for cash, or in payment of exchange for property or rights actually received or purchased by said corporation, provided that no stock shall be issued unless the corporation therefor has been received by said corporation. All transfers of stock shall be made on the books of said company at its office at Covington, Louisiana, on the surrender of the certificates therefor. No stockholder shall have authority or right to sell, or otherwise dispose of his stock, in whole or in part, without first giving the board of directors ten days written notice of his intention or desire to dispose of his stock or a part thereof, and allowing the board of directors the first opportunity of purchasing the stock.

Said corporation shall become a going concern and be authorized to do business as soon as \$5,000.00 of the capital stock shall have been subscribed for. The corporate powers of this corporation shall be vested in and exercised by a board of three directors, consisting of a president, vice president, secretary-treasurer, two of whom shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Said directors shall be elected annually from among the stockholders on the third Monday of each month of February in each year, commencing on the 19th day in the month of 1912. Notice of such election shall be given by at least five days written notice addressed to the stockholders at his last known place of residence. At said election all other meetings of the stockholders the voting shall be by ballot and each share of stock shall be entitled to one vote by the owner in person, or by written proxy.

Within one week of their election, above provided for, the board shall elect by a majority vote their president, a vice president, a secretary and a secretary-treasurer, and all of said officers and directors shall hold their respective offices for a period of one year from the date of their election, or until their successors are elected. In the event of the failure to hold an annual election, or to elect the officers as above provided for, shall not result in a dissolution of this corporation, but the then board of directors and officers shall hold their offices until their successors are duly elected.

Any vacancies in said board of directors shall be filled by the remaining members of the board for the unexpired term, at a meeting called for that purpose after three days prior notice in writing sent by mail to said directors at their last known address. The said board of directors shall have power to make by-laws, rules and regulations for the proper management and conduct of the affairs of this corporation, and to change, alter, abolish or amend same at any time, and shall have and exercise all the powers conferred by law on this corporation as set forth generally above. The said board of directors may also delegate any of said powers in the transaction of the business of this corporation to committees of their own body or to the officers and agents of this corporation.

The first board of directors of this corporation are hereby declared to be: Harvey E. Ellis, as president, W. A. White as vice president, W. A. Hood, as secretary-treasurer, who shall hold their respective offices until the third Monday of February, 1912, or until their successors are duly elected. It shall be the duty of the president of this corporation, or in the event of his inability to act, the vice president, to call a meeting of the board of directors or the stockholders thereof, on the written request to that effect, signed by two directors, or upon the written request to that effect of fifteen per cent of the capital stock issued.

ARTICLE V.

This corporation may be dissolved by a vote of three-fourths of the capital stock thereof issued, at a general meeting convened for that purpose after ten (10) days written notice of the object of said meeting, sent to each stockholder prior to said meeting, at his last known place of residence. Whenever this corporation is dissolved, whether by limitation or otherwise, its affairs shall be liquidated by two liquidating commissioners to be elected at such general meeting, and in the case of death or inability to act of any of said commissioners, the surviving commissioner shall appoint a successor and together they shall continue such liquidation to its termination.

ARTICLE VI.

This charter may be changed, altered or amended, and the capital

stock increased by a vote of two-thirds of the capital stock issued, at a general meeting convened for that purpose after thirty days prior notice in writing having been sent to each stockholder at his last known place of residence, sating the object of said meeting and forty days prior advertisement in a newspaper published in St. Tammany Parish, La.

ARTICLE VII.

No stockholder shall be held responsible or liable for the contracts of faults of this corporation in any further sum than the unpaid balance due the corporation on shares of stock owned by him, and shall any mere informality in the organization hereof have the effect of rendering this charter null, or of exposing a stockholder to any liability beyond such unpaid balance due on his stock.

Thus done and passed in my office in the town of Covington, Parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, on the day, month and year first above written in the presence of Karl J. Kohnke and J. Emmett Williams, competent witnesses, of this parish, who have signed these presents, together with said appearers and me, Notary, after due reading of the whole.
