ORDINANCE.
An ordinance imposing a street tax for the maintenance of streets and bridges within the corporate limits of the Village of Pearl River, providing for its enforcement by fine or imprisonment.
Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Village of Pearl River:

Section 1. That all able bodied persons between the ages of 18 and 55 years, residing within the limits of the Village of Pearl River shall be required to work four (4) days each year, when notified by the marshal or street commissioner, provided that any persons may relieve himself from such compulsory street work by paying a street tax in lieu thereof, which is hereby fixed at two dollars.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall not apply to transients or persons not residing within the village.
Be it further ordained, etc.

Section 3. That any work after being duly notified by the marshal or street commissioner, and who fails to pay the amount in lieu of said street work, as provided in section 1 of this ordinance, shall be arrested and after trial and conviction before the mayor's court shall be condemned to pay a fine not to exceed five dollars and in default of payment of said fine, be worked on the streets of the village for not more than ten days.
Be it further ordained, etc.

Section 4. That all ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed and that this ordinance shall be effective from and after its promulgation.

AN ORDINANCE
Authorizing the Cumberland Telephone and Telegraph Company, its successors or assigns, to erect, construct, maintain and operate through, over and under the streets, alleys and highways of Madisonville, La., a telephone exchange and telegraph lines for the purpose of conveying intelligence and communication by electricity and carrying on its business by such means within, to and from Madisonville, La., upon certain terms and conditions.
Be it ordained by the Mayor and Aldermen of the town of Madisonville, parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana:

Section 1. That the Cumberland Telephone and Telegraph Company, its successors or assigns, are hereby given permission to erect, construct, maintain and operate along, over and under the streets, alleys and highways of Madisonville, La., a telephone exchange and telegraph lines for the purpose of doing a general telephone business within, to and from Madisonville, La.
Sec. 2. Be it further ordained that the permission hereby granted shall be exercised within one year from the time this ordinance takes effect, otherwise the same shall lapse and become void.
Sec. 3. Be it further ordained for good and sufficient cause that this ordinance take effect and be in force from and after its publication.
