THE OPENING OF THE ABITA RIVER.

The hearing on the opening up of the Abita River, given by Lieut. Colonel Lancing H. Beach, of the Corps of Engineers of the United States Army, at Abita Springs last Saturday, brought out to a greater degree than has ever before been demonstrated the great need of having this river made navigable. There is no doubt from the testimony adduced that the increased business resulting therefrom would be compensatory, and that there would not only be an increased traffic by water and by rail, but that there would be brought under cultivation many idle acres of land and new employment given to labor. It is a difficult matter to secure statistical information in substantiation of resulting benefits, but the statement of the mill men cannot be discredited when they say that millions of feet of lumber, piling and railroad ties would be shipped by water if the opportunity was afforded. There is a large area of land from which most of the saw log timber has been cut, but which still has standing a large amount of piling and tie timber. As long as this timber stands the land will not be brought under cultivation. The high freight rate on piling makes it unprofitable to handle and contractors are driven into other fields. The manufacture of brick is another industry that it was shown would be largely increased, and while the United States Government will not take into consideration the protection of land from water, it is claimed that over a thousand acres of cultivable land would be secured from overflow.

The feasibility of making the Abita River navigable to the town of Abita Springs was brought to the attention of Hon. Robert C. Wickliffe by Judge Pons a year or so ago, and with characteristic energy and interest in any undertaking of benefit to the people in his district, Mr. Wickliffe succeeded in getting an order of survey. It is to be hoped that the active interest of the people of Abita Springs in securing this waterway will bear fruit, and that Colonel Beach will be able to make a favorable report to Congress.

THE ONE HUNDRETH ANNIVERSARY OF ST. TAMMANY PARISH.

The patriotic sentiment of St. Tammany Parish was fully demonstrated at the celebration of its one hundredth anniversary last Monday. Even the Weather Man acted in harmony with the occasion and gave us a fitting day for a memorable celebration that was proudly participated in by over two thousand people. It was such a celebration as would have aroused the highest feeling of enthusiasm in Mr. Roosevelt, for there were present at least six hundred children, representing the schools in different parts of the parish, both protestants and catholics, the future progenitors of celebrators of like occasions and the foundation of the progress of the parish in the years to come. Aside from the patriotic feeling that paid tribute to the past and present of St. Tammany, the approval of the improvements that have been made in Bogue Falaya Park added largely to the manifestations of interest in the occasion, and the entertainment that was given in the evening was presented before the largest audience that has ever attended any similar performance in Covington.

The park commission, and especially its president, Mr. D. J. Sanders, is deserving of the greatest praise for the efforts it has made to make this public resort a credit to the town, and in the success that has so far been attained the citizens of Covington cannot but have a feeling of pride and interest.

With such united support as was given to our centennial celebration last Monday there cannot fail to be made an impression of what could be accomplished in the promotion of our public undertakings if a like interest was manifested. The power for future accomplishment lies in the people. We have transportation by rail and by water. We have a soil that will produce anything under the sun. We have the healthiest country in the world, and we are so favorably situated geographically that without the development of any of our opportunities excepting the lumber interests we have moved along in advance of most sections of the State.

Whenever a determined effort has been made in any undertaking of citizens, was a grand success. The Women's Progressive Union and the School Improvement League have accomplished many excellent things for our community, and have always stood ready and willing to assist in any undertaking instituted by the men. All that is needed is harmonious and united action among the citizens, an elimination of all factional and personal differences, a free and open discussion of all public matters, with liberty of expression without offense to any one. When this broad and liberal policy is pursued and interest becomes manifest by actual work and the support of every beneficial public undertaking there will be no hesitancy in the progress of Covington or St. Tammany Parish.

GOT JAIL SENTENCES.

The sentiment of the people in regard to purity of the ballot is manifested by the general expression of satisfaction at the conviction and punishment of the New Orleans ballot box stuffers. The imprisonment sentence meets the approval of all and will stand as a warning that even the strongest political factions cannot afford to shield falsifiers of returns or manipulators of the ballot. Corruption of this kind would always be impossible if the citizens took interest enough in public affairs to put proper safeguards around the ballot box, but now that an example has been made of these cases, others morally capable of such unscrupulous work will hardly have the physical courage or temerity to engage in it.
