## SIGNS OF PROGRESS IN COVINGTON AND ST. TAMMANY PARISH.

A remarkable quality of the pessimist is that he fails to see the most apparent signs of progress. If he is a knocker against his own town, he will drive over a shell road and deplore the fact that the money was not spent for some other purpose, and if the streets are not shelled he will express his contempt for a one-horse town that cannot afford respectable thoroughfares. In fact, a pessimistic knocker cannot be pleased. He sees nothing good in the past and less in the future. But to the progressive and hopeful worker there are signs of future prosperity for St. Tammany Parish that cannot be denied. A drive over Covington will show her streets to be in much better condition than in the average town, and many of them are shelled. There is more money in her banks than ever before in her history. The police jury has accomplished more in public highway improvement in the past few years than for twenty years back, and the parish is in better financial condition. The old factional bitterness that made war in business and politics alike is passing out of existence and united action for the betterment of conditions only awaits the impulse and the opportunity.

As the boll weevil proved a blessing in disguise, so will the changed condition which makes it necessary for us to develop our resources. The dependence upon visitors, while "easy money," was not inducive, of that energetic action that builds up permanent prosperity. The result has been that an effort has been made to make the soil supply the deficiency. Truck growing associations have been organized and encouraged by merchant and farmer alike. Beans and potatoes have been shipped in carload lots, and shipment of various vegetables has been made by express. The business is just started. Shipments this year have exceeded those of last by 500 per cent. A creamery has been established at Mandeville; the dairy business is increasing both in product and in sanitary management; hog-raising is following in the wake of the largest corn crop we have ever produced; better stock and better implements are seen on the farms and all indications point to a steady increase in agricultural development. These facts prophesy future prosperity with greater emphasis than all the summer visitors of past years, with the advantage of a diffusion of money that will pour into the towns while supplying the needs of the farmer, and it is money that comes into the South from the North, the East and the West.

In this connection, we wish to note that the women of Covington and other towns in St. Tammany parish have never given up the battle for better conditions. They have maintained school leagues and mothers' clubs and progressive unions, and they have never ceased to work, under most discouraging circumstances. With equal pertinacity on the part of our male citizens accomplishment would have been much more rapid and much greater. What can be accomplished by determined effort is shown by the work of the park commission and the "Karnival Klub," and with an unselfish and united interest in the public welfare there is no reason why the Experimental Farm and Fair Association should not soon be in a position to accomplish the good work of which such an undertaking is capable. Sildell has already sold its school bonds, and it is said that the Covington school bonds will be taken by home people just as soon as they are placed on the market. All this is indicative of greater civic interest and a more progressive spirit among our citizens, and speaks for a more rapid advancement in the future. With the whole South on the eve of an era of prosperity; with two railroads, a motor line, two steamboat companies and schooners plying a navigable river at the very doors of Covington, with numerous other streams in the parish that are navigable or can be made navigable; with the cultivation of land becoming such a profitable employment that tracts are now being rented to be planted in truck, with the probability that over one hundred acres will be planted in strawberries next year, as a new venture, in addition to the increased acreage that will be put in vegetables for shipment, we fail to see how anyone can be pessimistic of the future of St. Tammany.

## THE STANDARD OIL DISSOLUTION.

The Standard Oil Company has finally been dissolved by legal process as a monopoly in restraint of trade and in violation of the Sherman anti-trust law comes as a surprise to many who considered the power of such a wealthy company too great to be overcome by either legal tribunals or legislative enactment. But while it is not to be desired that combination of capital should be so restrained as to prevent the efficiency of large investments and cheapness of production, it is of vital importance that the consumer should be the beneficiary of cheap production and not the victim of added profits to monopolistic ventures.

With this decision of the Supreme Court as a precedent, the Sherman act becomes a valuable and controlling power in the handling of trusts and corporations whose greed takes them beyond the bounds of legitimate business, and if there is to be formulated any Federal incorporation act, as indicated by the press reports, great care should be taken that in so doing no loophole is left through which escape may be made from the control which has now been obtained.
