THE NEW CARDINALS.
Rome, Nov. 27.—In the Hall of the Consistory at the Vatican today the formal ratification of the Pope's nomination of nineteen new members of the Sacred College was carried out with simple ceremonial. The striking feature of the consistory which was attended by the Pope and the cardinals resident in Rome, as well as the visiting cardinals, was the elevation of three American prelates. Mr. Farley, Archbishop of New York; Mr. O'Connell, Archbishop of Boston, and Mr. Falconio, the apostolic delegate at Washington, who now returns from that office.
