MAN WITH DYNAMITE THREATENS EXPOSE.
Nabbed in Pennsylvania Town, Says He Will Not Take all the Blame.

Pittsburg, Dec. 27.—"I'm going to clear myself. I will not take all the blame for this and the rest of them will have to take their medicine along with me." is the utterance credited Wednesday to George Bridges a stranger arrested at Monessen, Pa., while carrying a suit-case containing seventy-two sticks of dynamite and a roll of fuse. Bridges weakened under the police sweating to which he had been subjected and according to the authorities declared he would make a clean breast of it when taken before a magistrate for a preliminary hearing late Wednesday afternoon. Little is known of the man. He appeared at Monessen several weeks ago. Eight thousand non-union men are employed in the mills of the town.
