TO THOSE INTERESTED IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE MISSISSIPPI VALLEY

The recent floods and great disasters attendant thereon, have shown the inadequacy of the present levees, throughout the valley, to afford the people protection. The resiliency power of such levees as we had, at the same time, demonstrated beyond question, the feasibility of the levee system and been convincing of the fact that all that is needed is a higher and wider levee with adequate banquettes where necessary.

The waters from 31 States of this Union and a large part of the Dominion of Canada flow between these levees and the question has arisen to the height of a great national problem. The people throughout the United States are interested as they never were before in solving the great question of protecting this fertile territory. Without a levee which will protect, the development along drainage lines, roads, agriculture or any other development must stop.

There has been adopted in both the Republican and Democratic National platforms a strong plank advocating the completion of the levee system in a business like way and both of the great parties are absolutely pledged toward cooperation. It is left for the people to keep this sentiment alive and actively before the country. There will be held in the city of Memphis, Tenn., on September 24, 25 and 26, the greatest levee convention in the history of the nation. All persons throughout the country who are property holders and concerned in interests protected by the levees are invited, and urged to attend. Governors of States, mayors of cities, levee boards and all commercial organizations are expected to appoint delegates to this convention. We have been assured that the various railroads will give the delegates an exceedingly low rate and the same will be published in a short time.

The Democratic Executive Committee of the 26th Judicial District of Louisiana, comprising the parishes of St. Tammany and Washington, met at the court house in the town of Covington, La., on this the 10 day of July, 1912, pursuant to call issued by the chairman of said committee, Mr. Warren R. Badon, of said committee called the committee to order, the following members being present: Warren R. Badon, chairman; P. C. Smith, secretary; E. E. Bollinger, from St. Tammany parish; M. A. Thigpen by proxy of Lindsay M. A. Dougal, H. C. Richardson and Magee Ott.

A quorum being present the committee proceeded to business. The chairman stated the committee was called together for the purpose of ordering and calling a primary election to nominate the nominees of the Democratic party for Judge and District Attorney for the 26th Judicial District of Louisiana, comprising the parishes of St. Tammany and Washington. The following resolution was read and submitted: Be it resolved by the Democratic Executive Committee of the 26th Judicial District of Louisiana for the purpose of nominating the nominees of the Democratic party for the Judgeship and District Attorneyship of the 26th Judicial District of Louisiana, and also to elect six members to compose the Democratic Executive Committee for said judicial district, that the parishes of St. Tammany and three members to be elected from the parish of Washington.

Be it further resolved, etc., That in the event a second primary election is necessary to determine who are the nominees for the judge and district attorney, or for either, that said second primary election shall be held on the same day and date, as the second primary election for Supreme Judge and Congressmen, and that said primary elections shall be held and conducted as required by law. Moved by Mr. P. C. Smith and seconded by Mr. E. E. Bollinger, that said resolution be adopted. Carried. The following resolution was then read and submitted: Be it resolved by the Democratic Executive Committee of the 26th Judicial District of Louisiana, that an assessment of fifty dollars is hereby levied and assessed against, and shall be paid by each candidate for Judge and District Attorney, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the said primary election hereinafter ordered to be held on September 3, 1912.

Be it further resolved, That all candidates for the nomination of Judge and District Attorney shall file their nomination papers and pay the assessment hereby levied, to the chairman of this committee within twenty days from this date and not later than Wednesday, July 30, 1912, at midnight. Any candidate failing to pay the assessment herein fixed and levied his nomination papers will be disregarded. Be it further resolved, That the candidates for membership of the Judicial Committee shall file their nomination with said chairman within the same time as herein fixed for the candidates for the Judgeship and District Attorneyship, except they shall pay no assessment. It was moved by Mr. E. E. Bollinger and seconded by Mr. P. C. Smith that the above resolution be adopted. Carried. There being no further business the committee, upon motion of Mr. E. E. Bollinger, seconded by Mr. P. C. Smith, adjourned, subject to call. W. R. BADON, Chairman. P. C. SMITH, Secretary.
