**WEEVIL IS NOT ERADICATED.**

Farmers Should Guard Against Danger from WEVIL Winter.

A recent special dispatch to the Times-Democrat from Washington, says:

In a talk with Representative Jon. E. Russell, Bradford Knapp, chief of the farm demonstration division of the Department of Agriculture sounded a note of warning to the cotton planters not only of Louisiana, but of Mississippi and adjoining areas in Arkansas and Texas. What he deprecated the planters in Louisiana in particular to remember is that the boll weevil has not been eradicated, even from the sections of the cotton belt where none of the insects was found last season.

His injunction to all is to plant on the assumption that the pest will reappear during the coming season, because the winter has been mild. In a good many spots in the belt last season, the infestation was great the mild winter the pest has multiplied, so that unless the planters take pains with their crop, conditions will be intolerable.

In particular he hopes they will put in at least half their acreage with short staple quick maturing seed. He has heard that many of the planters are contemplating putting in only long staple, and that does not appeal to him. In that view, Mr. Russell agrees with Mr. Knapp. The Senator elect, even before he had the talk, had come to the conclusion that it was the thing to do. Neither Mr. Russell nor Mr. Knapp believe it will be wise, this year, to put all the eggs in one basket.

By taking the precautions suggest by taking the precautions suggested, Messrs. Russell and Knapp believe the evil of the mild winter has done in the way of giving the weevil an extension of tenure will be minimized, if not wholly neutralized.

**20 CASH REGISTER MEN GO TO PRISON.**

Sentence Range From Three Months To One Year and Court Costs.

Cincinnati, O., Feb. 17.—John H. Patterson, president of the National Cash Register Company, who, with twenty-eight officials or former officials of the company, was convicted of criminal violation of the Sherman anti-trust law, was sentenced Monday to pay a fine of \$5,000 and to serve one year in jail.

The twenty-eight other defendants were sentenced to terms ranging from nine months to a year in jail and to pay the costs.

The men were convicted last Thursday of having violated the criminal section of the Sherman anti-trust law.

George Edgeter, of Dayton, secretary of the company, was given the lightest sentence of three months. This was later ordered set aside by the court. Wm. Simpson, treasurer; Alfred A. Thomas, of Dayton, and Jonathan B. Hayward, of New York were given nine months in jail. The others were sentenced to one year.

Before passing sentence Judge Holtzner denied the motion of the defendants for a new trial. The bond of President Patterson was increased to \$10,000, the sureties of the other defendants remaining the same.

Formal notice of an appeal to the United States circuit court was given by attorneys for the defendants.
