The exhibition of their products will be placed in the Agriculture Hall, in which the various general agricultural displays are to be seen each year. The parish fair showing this year, judging by these reports, will surpass anything else in that particular line that has been seen at the Louisiana Fair. It will demonstrate that the parish fair movement is steadily spreading. Since the last state exhibition several parish associations have been organized. State Fair Secretary Brueggerhoff assisted in the organization work, with the understanding that the parishes be represented at the State Fair.

The parish fair has been billed throughout the parish and in Hammond and New Orleans. Farmers are anxious for a good display and will keep their choice products for that purpose. It is very much desired that a good display of parish products may be entered at the State Fair.

Mr. Alexus will make a display of twelve products, and canned goods. New Orleans fanciers will enter some fine chickens, but they will only compete for the special prizes offered by outsiders. Arrangements have been made to have all the judges appointed from outside—from the State Agricultural College and elsewhere so that there may be no chance for any partiality. The judges will be experts.
