CHARTER
of the
MANDEVILLE FIRE COMPANY
NO. 1.

United States of America, State of Louisiana, Parish of St. Tammany.

Before me, the undersigned Notary Public in and for the parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned, personally came and appeared the persons whose names are hereunto subscribed who declared that availing themselves of the benefits of the provisions of the laws of the State of Louisiana, they and each of them do hereby associate themselves as a body corporate in law for a period of ninety-nine years, under the following articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I.
The name of this corporation shall be the Mandeville Fire Company No. One.

ARTICLE II.
The objects and purposes for which this association is formed are hereby declared to be: The formation of a Fire Association, to own, operate and maintain one or more fire engines, and all necessary equipment and housing for same, to extinguish fires in the town of Mandeville, and near vicinity; to develop the spirit of fraternity and friendship among its members and to provide doctors and medical assistance and sick benefits to such members; to own or lease property necessary for the purposes of its organization, and to buy, sell, lease, mortgage, pledge or hypothecate the same at will for the uses and purposes of this Association and to make necessary rules and regulations as it may see fit.

ARTICLE III.
The powers of this corporation shall be vested in a Board of Directors, who shall be the various officers of this corporation, to-wit: President, Vice President, Second Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Chief Engineer, First Assistant Engineer, Second Assistant Engineer, Fire Chief, Second Assistant Chief, Third Assistant Chief, Fourth Assistant Chief, and Fire Marshal. The said Board of Directors shall be elected from and by the members of this organization at the annual meeting to be held on the second Monday in February, and on said day annually thereafter. The officers shall hold their several positions for twelve months from the date of election or until their successors shall have been elected. Any vacancies occurring in said Board of Directors for the unexpired term at a meeting called for that purpose after ten days notice in writing sent by mail to said directors at their last known addresses. A majority said Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The said Board of Directors shall have the power to make all by-laws, rules and regulations for the proper management of the affairs of this corporation, and to change, alter, amend or abolish the same at their pleasure. The domicile of this corporation shall be the town of Mandeville, Louisiana, and the president is the legally constituted authority to receive all legal process, and in his absence the Vice President.

ARTICLE IV.
The first Board of Directors of this corporation shall be: President, W. T. Newman; Vice President, Geo. F. Blerhorst; Second Vice President, Fred. J. Heintz; Secretary, Felix A. Jones, Sr.; Treasurer, F. Edw. Vix; Chief Engineer, Harry T. Carroll; First Assistant Engineer, B. E. Dietrich; Second Assistant Engineer, Harry Bourgeois; Fire Chief on Ground, A. Hartman; First Assistant Chief, E. H. Baudot; Second Assistant Chief, Wade Peters; Third Assistant Chief, George Smith, Jr.; Fourth Assistant Chief, Murphy Smith.
It shall be the duty of the President of this corporation to give notice of its general meeting and to call special meetings of the Board of Directors on the written request of one-third of the members of said corporation.

ARTICLE V.
This corporation may be dissolved by a vote of three-fourths of the members at a general meeting called for that purpose, after fifteen days notice be published in a newspaper published in the parish of St. Tammany, immediately preceding said meeting and written notice of the objects of said meeting sent to each member by the secretary. Whenever this corporation is dissolved, whether by liquidation or otherwise, its affairs shall be liquidated by three liquidating commissioners to be elected at such meeting and in case of death or inability to act of any of the said commissioners the surviving commissioners shall appoint a successor and together they shall continue such liquidation.

ARTICLE VI.
This charter may be changed, altered or amended at a general meeting called for that purpose in the same manner as provided for in article five for the liquidation of said charter before liquidation.

Thus done and signed at Mandeville, St. Tammany parish, Louisiana, on this second day of February, 1914, in the presence of the undersigned witnesses, who, with said applicants, and me, Notary, sign these presents, after full reading of the whole.
