COURSES FOR ALL TEACHERS.

The catalogue and pamphlets of the State Normal School at Natchitoches, La., announce broader and more varied courses to be offered at the summer school which opens June 1, 1914. There will be courses in all subjects that second and third grade teachers require to raise their certificates; courses in all subjects on which first grade teachers are examined; courses for rural teachers in agriculture, gardening, live stock, dairying, club work, rural problems and sociology; courses in domestic science and manual training; courses in music and art for specialists and supervisors; courses for special high school teachers in advanced history and literature, science and mathematics, economics and professional work. All persons interested should write the school for information. The necessary expenses for six weeks are \$24; for 10 weeks, \$38. This does not include books. In the summer school, the adopted textbooks are used.

COVINGTON MAN ESCAPES FROM MEXICO.

Mr. Geo. H. Douglas, Well Known in Covington, Reaches New Orleans in Safety.

Quarantine, May 4.—"Bon jour, senior," followed by a fusillade of properly-accented French, was the only thing that saved F. N. Lebeuf, a New Orleans man living at 2017 Peters Avenue, while he was making his way through Mexico to the coast. Rebels and Mexican soldiers were on all sides, and to assert American citizenship seemed like inviting death. Mr. Lebeuf was manager of the Constancia Plantation Company's enterprise, eighty miles up from Puerto Mexico. He is accompanied by George H. Douglas, of Covington.

"I was mighty thankful to know that my complexion and appearance enabled me to pass for a native-born Frenchman," averred Mr. Lebeuf. "My escape from Mexico is due largely to my ability to speak the French language fluently, and I was able to escape much of the abuse handed out to my American countrymen."

Mr. Lebeuf left his position in Mexico without anything worth mentioning, as he had no time to gather up his belongings. Mr. Douglas reached Puerto Mexico some days before he did.
