POLICE JURY

Covington, La., June 5, 1914.

In accordance with resolution of police jury of the parish of St. Tammany, adopted April 20, 1914, the police jury met in special session for the purpose of counting the votes and promulgating the returns of the special election held in the parish of St. Tammany, La., on the second day of June, 1914, and to attend to such other matters pertaining to Good Roads as might be advisable and necessary.

Roll call by the secretary showed the following members present, to-wit: Wm. Bruhl, Herman Schultz, G. F. Bierhorst, E. E. Talley, A. D. Crawford, F. L. Dutsch, Jno. A. Todd, Absent: B. A. Schneider, Louis Peters and J. B. Howze.

The following resolution was introduced by A. D. Crawford, seconded by John A. Todd, and unanimously carried, to-wit:

Be it resolved, that the police jury of the parish of St. Tammany do now proceed to open the ballot boxes used at the special election held in the parish of St. Tammany on June 2, 1914, to examine and count the votes cast at said election, contained in said boxes, in numbers and amounts, examine and canvass the returns made by the Commissioners and Clerks serving at said election, as shown by the tally sheets, poll list, and compiled statements of the voters made by said Commissioners and Clerks presiding at said election; all in accordance with resolution of this board, ordering said election, of date April 20, 1914.

The police jury then proceeded, in the presence of three competent witnesses, to count the ballots contained in the boxes used at said election, and examine same as to numbers and amounts, inspect the poll lists, tally sheets and compiled statements of voters made by the commissioners and clerks presiding at said election and after such inspection and examination and canvass of said ballot and returns were made, the following resolution was introduced by G. F. Bierhorst, duly seconded by Wm. Bruhl, and unanimously carried, to-wit:

RESOLUTION

Be it remembered that we, the police jury of the parish of St. Tammany as a board of commissioners for the election held in and for the parish of St. Tammany, on June 2, 1914, met to-day in open session at the courthouse in the town of Covington, La., at the hour of 10 o'clock a. m., for the purpose of counting our respective parts in two boxes, and examine same, both as to numbers and amounts and inspect and examine and compile the returns sent in by the commissioners and clerks presiding at said election throughout the parish of St. Tammany, on the second day of June, 1914, for and against the proposition submitted to the property tax payers qualified as electors under the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, conformably to the resolution adopted on the 20th day of April, 1914, by the police jury of the parish of St. Tammany, La.

The meeting having been regularly called to order by Herman Schultz, president, and all members of said police jury being present except H. A. Schneider, Louis Peters and J. B. Howze, did, in open session and in the presence of H. S. Blossman, J. M. Cooper and M. Zinzer, three competent witnesses, and in the presence of as many others as chose to attend the examination and inspection and compilation of the returns of said

meeting, and having ascertained from said inspection, examination and compilation that the votes, in number and amount cast at the aforesaid election held throughout the parish of St. Tammany, La., for and against the proposition submitted to the vote of the property tax payers of said parish by a resolution of the police jury of the parish of St. Tammany adopted April 20, 1914, to-wit:

"Shall a debt be incurred and bonds be issued of the parish of St. Tammany to the amount of \$180,000, to run no longer than thirty years from date and to bear interest not exceeding five (5) per cent per annum, payable annually or semi-annually for the purpose of building and constructing public roads throughout the parish of St. Tammany."

Number of votes cast for the proposition submitted, as aforesaid, six hundred and forty-one (641).

Number of votes cast against the proposition submitted aforesaid, two hundred and three (203).

Amount of assessed valuation of property cast in favor of the proposition submitted, as aforesaid, seven hundred and sixty-five thousand two cents (\$746,765.02).

Amount of assessed valuation of property cast against the proposition submitted, as aforesaid, one hundred and fifty thousand and fifteen dollars (\$150,015).

After having counted the vote, inspected and examined same as to numbers and amounts and having inspected and examined and canvassed the poll lists, tally sheets and compiled statement of votes made by the commissioners and clerks presiding at said election, and compiled the returns of said election, and the following resolution was introduced by G. F. Bierhorst, duly seconded by Wm. Bruhl, and unanimously carried, to-wit:

Section 1. Be it resolved by the police jury of the parish of St. Tammany, in special session assembled, that a debt of one hundred and eighty thousand dollars (\$180,000) be and the same is hereby incurred for and in the name of the parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, and that as evidencing said debt negotiable bonds be and they are hereby ordered and authorized to be issued in the amount of one hundred and eighty thousand (\$180,000) dollars bearing interest at the rate of five (5) per cent per annum, interest payable semi-annually, to run for a period of twenty-nine (29) years and issue in denomination of one thousand (\$1000) dollars and payable annually at such time and place as is hereinafter designated in conformity with article 281 of the constitution of the State of Louisiana and laws carrying same into effect and that the whole of the funds realized from the said debt and the sale of the said bonds be used for the purpose of building and constructing public roads throughout the parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, that Herman Schultz, president, E. D. Kentzel, secretary of the police jury of the parish of St. Tammany, Louisiana, be and they are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to have prepared, and to sign and execute under the seal of the parish of St. Tammany, negotiable bonds to be known and designated as road bonds of the parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, said bonds to be of the denomination of one thousand (\$1000) dollars each, to be one hundred and eighty (180) in number and numbered from one (1) to one hundred and eighty (180) inclusive, aggregating the sum of one hundred and eighty thousand (\$180,000) dollars, dated July 1, 1914, and bearing interest at the rate of five (5) per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the 1st day of January and July of each and every year after date thereof until the payment of the principal sum, the principal and interest to be payable at the Interstate Trust and Banking Company, New Orleans, La.; the said interest to be evidenced by coupons attached to said bond showing the amount of semi-annual interest due on each bond until its maturity, said coupon, however, may be executed to a facsimile signature of the president and secretary of the police jury of the parish of St. Tammany, and said bonds shall become due and payable as follows, to-wit:

1 to 3... \$2,000... July 1, 1915
4 to 6... \$3,000... July 1, 1916
7 to 9... \$3,000... July 1, 1917
10 to 12... \$3,000... July 1, 1918
13 to 16... \$4,000... July 1, 1919
17 to 20... \$4,000... July 1, 1920
21 to 24... \$4,000... July 1, 1921

of which the clerk is ordered to file with the Secretary of State, another copy with the clerk of the district court of the parish of St. Tammany, La., and the third copy to deposit in the archives of the office of the police jury of the parish of St. Tammany, Louisiana.

In evidence whereof the president of said board and the members thereof have signed this process verbal on this 5th day of June, 1914, in open session called for the purpose aforesaid, held at the courthouse at Covington, La., St. Tammany parish, in the presence of the aforesaid three competent witnesses, who have witnessed the proceedings herein, and have signed this process verbal, together with the president of said board.

It was moved by F. L. Dutsch, seconded by E. E. Talley:

Whereas, at a special election duly and regularly called and held throughout the parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, on the 2d day of June, 1914, the following proposition was submitted to the vote of the property tax payers of the said parish, qualified as electors under the constitution and laws of this State, to-wit:

"Shall a debt be incurred and bonds issued of the parish of St. Tammany to the amount of \$180,000, to run no longer than thirty years from date and to bear interest not exceeding five (5) per cent per annum payable annually or semi-annually for the purpose of building and constructing public roads throughout the parish of St. Tammany."

And, whereas, the incurring of said debt and the issuing of said bonds was duly and regularly authorized by the vote and the majority in numbers and amounts of the property tax payers of the said parish voting at said election, as will appear by resolution of the police jury of the parish of St. Tammany, of date June 5, 1914, promulgating said election;

And, whereas, under the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana it is necessary and desirable that the police jury should incur said debt and issue said bond, now, therefore:

Section 1. Be it resolved by the police jury of the parish of St. Tammany, in special session assembled, that a debt of one hundred and eighty thousand dollars (\$180,000) be and the same is hereby incurred for and in the name of the parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, and that as evidencing said debt negotiable bonds be and they are hereby ordered and authorized to be issued in the amount of one hundred and eighty thousand (\$180,000) dollars bearing interest at the rate of five (5) per cent per annum, interest payable semi-annually, to run for a period of twenty-nine (29) years and issue in denomination of one thousand (\$1000) dollars and payable annually at such time and place as is hereinafter designated in conformity with article 281 of the constitution of the State of Louisiana and laws carrying same into effect and that the whole of the funds realized from the said debt and the sale of the said bonds be used for the purpose of building and constructing public roads throughout the parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana.

In testimony whereof the police jury of the parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana, has caused this bond to be signed by its president and attested by its secretary and sealed with the seal of the parish of St. Tammany, and the interest coupons hereto annexed to be executed by facsimile signatures of its president and secretary, this first day of July, 1914.

Section 4. Be it further resolved, etc., that the contract entered into on April 20, 1914, by the president of this board with the Interstate

Trust and Banking Company at New Orleans, La., and the St. Tammany Banking Company and Savings Bank at Covington, La., for the purchase and sale of these bonds, be and same is hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 5. Be it further resolved, etc., that the proceeds of sale of said bonds shall constitute a Trust Fund which shall be devoted to and used exclusively for the purpose of building and constructing public roads throughout the parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana.

Section 6. Be it further resolved, etc., that this resolution shall be published in the official organ of the parish of St. Tammany in the manner provided by law and it shall be the duty of the president to cause such publication to be made.

Section 7. Be it resolved, etc., that in accordance with provisions of Article 281 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana, and the Acts of the General Assembly carrying same into effect, there shall be levied and imposed annually, while any of the bonds hereby authorized are outstanding, in excess of all other taxes, a tax on all the property subject to State taxation within the limits of the parish of St. Tammany, La., which shall be sufficient to pay the semi-annual interest and the maturing principal of outstanding bonds.

Section 8. Be it further resolved, etc., that for the purpose of paying the interest to be due on the bonds herein provided for on January, 1st and July 1st, 1915, and for the purpose of paying the principal of such bonds as mature on July 1st, 1915, that there be and there is hereby levied for the year 1914 a tax of two (2) mills on the dollar of the assessed value of all of the property subject to State taxation within the limits of the parish of St. Tammany, State of Louisiana.

Thus done, read, adopted, approved and signed in open session at Covington, St. Tammany parish, La., this 5th day of June, 1914.
