WHO SAID ST. TAMMANY ISN'T COMING ALONG.

For the benefit of those who have the habit of knocking everything that comes along in the way of advancement in the parish, I wish to say something. Now, I want you to stop "cussing" the parish long enough to read this with a clear, unobscured mind, and after you have read it see if you haven't decided that this is really a good parish, after all, and that it is you yourself that is no good, if you are still a knocker.

A dipping vat is to be put in each ward at the expense of the parish to fight the pesky, ugly, despicable parasite—the cattle tick. This little pest drains the blood of life from your milk cows almost one-fourth as fast as you can produce it with costly feed. The pest does not rest at night, but works night and day trying to destroy what you are trying to make. The dipping vat is a great step toward doing away with this pest and you should hunt up your police juror and shake hands with him for his wisdom and foresight.

The school system in this parish is as good as any of the rural parishes. The buildings will average better than most of them. Our teachers are all well trained and well qualified to fill their respective positions. We are coming to the front as fast as anything in school work. Compare your school system of twenty years ago with what you have now. See what we have? A great improvement—greater than other parishes can boast of.

We have, in the parish, several canning machines that are doing good work, and the point to remember is the canning habit will grow, and men and women will take as much pains in storing up their winter supply of fruits and vegetables as the ant does in storing away his winter food. This is a good move and will be the means of saving thousands of dollars to the parish that has gone to other sections heretofore.

The new interest in agriculture in and around Covington is but a sample of the spirit of the whole parish. The association formed recently to grow the strawberry and place it on the market in car lots shows the spirit of advancement. The association is going to put in enough berries to ship in car lots—no fooling about this. They are going to get their own fertilizer, plants and crates. Well, that is their ticket. Are you going to help in the movement or keep on knocking?

Recently three boys were appointed to represent this parish at the Lafayette Industrial Institute. These boys are to be trained in agriculture and are to come back to this parish and spread their knowledge everywhere. We need them, and the police jury is to be handshaken once more.

The race track at St. Paul's College is fine—a card or ticket that will draw people to this parish. Can other parishes boast of such a trump card?

We have a fair here every fall, and going to have the best fair this fall ever known for a parish fair. Are you going to help us in this fair or keep on knocking and drinking "ozone"?

Did you say that hard times were knocking at your door? Well, listen: Louis Werhli has sold, in the past eleven months, thirty automobiles. Think of that! Think of it. All in the little town of Covington. That sounds like somebody not wearing a frown on their faces. Times are not hard. It is you who make them hard. Everything is higher now in the way of foodstuffs than they were during the years when you say times were good. What is the matter? You have not plowed enough, planted enough and harvested enough.
