AN ORDINANCE.

An ordinance to effect the removal of the Restricted District from its present location.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the town council of the town of Covington, Louisiana, in legal session convened, That what is known as the Restricted District, comprised within Square No. 2600, and within Jefferson and Theard Avenues, and Diamond and Ruby streets, in its present location is a public nuisance, and shall, from and after the first of January, 1915, be moved.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, That from and after the first day of January, 1915, it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, directly or indirectly, to keep or manage any house of prostitution or ill fame, or be connected with any such house or establishment, either as employee or participant, or as owner to rent any property for such purpose, within the above described limits.

Section 3. Be it further provided, That nothing in this ordinance be construed to authorize or license any person or persons to, directly or indirectly, keep or manage any such establishment, or be connected with such establishment either as employee or participant, or as owner to rent any property for such purpose, in any other portion of the town of Covington.

Section 4. Be it further provided, That whoever shall violate the provisions of the second section of this ordinance, shall on trial and conviction thereof, be fined not less than twenty-five dollars and not more than fifty dollars, or be imprisoned not more than ten days, or both at the discretion of the court.
