Although a dense throng lined the borders of the fields of the different events, there was no crowding and the athletes were not interfered with in any way. Mr. Fox, Comanager, St. Paul's instructor in athletics and manager of athletics at the fair, deserves credit for the manner in which the events were pulled off. He has shown that St. Tammany parish has some good athletic material and that an interest in athletics can be awakened here that will place us distinctly on the map of outdoor sports. The Relay Race. This event was a peculiar one, the race being from Abita Springs to Covington, a distance of four and three-quarter miles, and as there has been a long dry spell the roads were pretty dusty. The race ended at the park gate, where the fair grounds are situated, and was in favor of St. Paul's College, which was handicapped, having four men against three, Grimmer of St. Paul's, running two miles. Richard, St. Paul's, first, clearing 11 feet; K. Moise and L. Smith, Covington High School, second and third. 1-2-Mile Walk—Harry Fitzpatrick, scratch, 7:02 2-5; N. Ticey, St. Paul's, (40 yard handicap) second; V. Delcambre, St. Paul's, (40 yard handicap) third. Fitzpatrick attempted to lower the world's record, but did not succeed, although he easily outwalked the field, after giving all a handicap of forty yards. L. Di Benedetto of New Orleans, secretary of the A. A. U., was the official referee, and Tad Gormly of the Y. M. C. C. of New Orleans was the starter.
