TICKS SERIOUSLY AFFECT MILK YIELDS. Feeding Ticks Costs More Than Killing Them. Washington, D. C., Aug. 25.—Even with so-called immune cattle, ticks have caused a loss varying from 1.5 to 3.4 quarts of milk a day, according to experiments conducted by the U. S. Department of Agriculture.

While the new formal note is in preparation, state department officials are continuing their informal efforts to secure the release of the millions of dollars worth of German and Austrian goods consigned to the United States now being held up at Rotterdam and other neutral ports as a result of the British order in council.

Unofficial representations to Great Britain have been authorized in an effort to bring forth a further statement of the conditions under which these goods may be shipped without interference by the British fleet.
