The following petition was read: To the Honorable President and Members of the Police Jury of St. Tammany Parish, La.:

Whereas various railroad companies throughout the State of Louisiana have made application to the Honorable Railroad Commission of the State of Louisiana, wherein they ask for an increase in rates on sand, gravel, shells and crushed stone;

And whereas it has been clearly shown that the proposed increase in rates on sand, gravel, shells and crushed stone will cost the parish of St. Tammany from three hundred to six hundred dollars per mile more and therefore cause an injustice and undue hardship on the people of the State and of this parish, and will have the effect of hindering the construction of good roads in this parish;

And whereas it has been clearly shown that the present rate on sand, gravel, shell and crushed stone is adequate to pay the railroad companies for hauling same, and if anything the said rates are excessive and should be reduced in order that the building and construction of good roads throughout the State will be facilitated instead of hindered.

Therefore, be it resolved by the police jury of the parish of St. Tammany, La., That the Railroad Commission of the State of Louisiana be, and they are hereby petitioned to not raise the rates on sand, gravel, shells and crushed stone, but that their honorable body adopt the rates applied for by the Hon. George Atkins, of Shreveport, La. in order that the building and construction of good roads throughout the State will be facilitated instead of hindered.
