

Hon. Prentiss B. Carter, who has just been appointed to the bench of the Twenty-Sixth Judicial District Court, is well known in the Florida parishes, where he was reared. He received his rudimentary education at the Jesuit College, New Orleans. He taught school in Livingston, Tangipahoa and Washington parishes, after his marriage, at the same time being engaged in farming. He completed his law course under Judge Stephen D. Ellis, whose great legal knowledge laid the foundation for the success that has met Judge Carter in the practice of his profession in the Florida parishes and in the Federal Courts of New Orleans.

Baseball and Tennis Games Played in This Parish the Past Week.


