At a meeting of citizens of St. Tammany parish, held at the court house Saturday, June 3, the following petition was drawn up for signatures of those in favor of this as a law. The great benefit of such a law has been fully recognized by progressive communities.

In order to get the popular sentiment it is asked that all citizens of St. Tammany parish who are in favor of this legislation sign the petition below and mail same to E. I. Covington, La.

To the Honorable the President and Members of the Police Jury of St. Tammany Parish, La.:

We, the undersigned citizens and residents of the parish of St. Tammany, La., do respectfully petition your honorable body to pass the necessary legislation in order to prohibit the roaming at large of hogs and goats in the parish of St. Tammany, La., for the reason that when such animals are allowed to roam at large there is great danger of their spreading disease, destroying crops and causing damage to fences, etc.

AN ORDINANCE

Ordering a special election to be held in School District No. 9, in the Parish of St. Tammany, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the said district the question of the levy of a special tax of two and one-half mills for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public schools of the said school district; that is to say for the purpose of paying teachers salaries in the public schools of said school district.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Parish Board of School Directors of the parish of St. Tammany, Louisiana, that a special election be and hereby is ordered to be held in School District No. 9, in the parish of St. Tammany, Louisiana, on Tuesday, the 11th day of July, 1916, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the said school district entitled to vote thereat, the question of the levy of a special tax of two and one-half mills on the dollar on all property in the said school district subject to State taxation, for a period of two years, the proceeds of said tax to be used in giving additional aid to public schools of the said school district, that is, for the purpose of paying teachers salaries of the said school district.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that the ballots to be used at the said election shall be prepared by the secretary of the parish board of school directors, and shall be in the following form:

Proposition to levy a two and one-half (.0025) mills special tax on all property subject to taxation in School District No. 9 of the parish of St. Tammany, Louisiana, annually, for the period of two years, for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public schools of the said school district; that is, for the purpose of paying teachers for said district.

NOTICE TO VOTERS—To vote in favor of the proposition submitted upon this ballot, place a cross (X) mark in the square after the word "YES"; to vote against it place a similar mark after the word "NO."

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., that the Secretary of the Parish Board of School Directors be and he is hereby ordered to cause to be prepared for use at the said election the tally sheets, lists of qualified electors, assessed valuation of property, blank statements for the completion

of the vote, in number and amount, and other election blanks that may be required for the purpose of holding the said election, to cause the same to be placed in the ballot box for use at the voting precinct, and to make provision for the transmission of the ballot box to the precinct of the school district at which the election is to be held.

Section 4. Be it further ordained, etc., that the polling place for the said election shall be at the usual polling place in District No. 9, and the following three commissioners and clerk are appointed: F. A. Bourgeois, Dr. J. F. Polk and J. W. Decker, commissioners, and T. J. Eddins, clerk, all of whom shall serve without compensation.

Section 5. Be it further ordained, etc., that the Parish Board of School Directors shall meet at 10 o'clock a. m. on the 21st day of June, 1916, for the purpose, in open session, of examining and counting the ballots, canvassing the returns and declaring the result of the said election.

Section 6. Be it further ordained, etc., that the president of the Parish Board of School Directors be and he is hereby instructed to give public notice of the said election by proclamation to be duly published according to law in the following form:

PROCLAMATION.

Pursuant to a resolution by the Parish Board of School Directors of the parish of St. Tammany, Louisiana, at its adjourned meeting held on the 8th day of June, 1916, I, N. H. Fitzsimons, president of the Parish Board of School Directors, hereby give notice that, in compliance with said resolution, a special election will be held in School District No. 9, parish of St. Tammany, Louisiana, on the 11th day of July, 1916, for the purpose of submitting to the property taxpayers qualified under the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana to vote at said election, the following proposition to-wit:

To levy a special tax of two and one-half mills on the dollar on all the property in School District No. 9 of the parish of St. Tammany, Louisiana, subject to State taxation, annually for the period of two years, for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public schools; that is, for the purpose of paying teachers salaries for the public schools of said district No. 9.

For the purposes of said special election the polling places will be the Town Hall in the town of Slidell and the following commissioners and clerk of election have been appointed to serve at this election, all of whom will serve without compensation: F. A. Bourgeois, J. F. Polk, J. W. Decker, commissioners, and T. J. Eddins, clerk.

At said special election the polls will open at seven o'clock a. m., and close at five o'clock p. m., and the election will be conducted in accordance with the laws of Louisiana applicable thereto.

Notice is hereby given that at 10 o'clock a. m., on the 21st day of June, 1916, the said Parish Board of School Directors of the parish of St. Tammany, Louisiana, will meet at Covington, La., and in open session proceed to open the ballot box, examine and count the ballots in number and amount, examine and canvass the returns, and declare the result of said special election.

Section 7. Be it further ordained, etc., that the special election herein and hereby provided for shall be held and conducted and the returns thereof shall be made under the provisions of Act 255 of 1910 and amendments thereof, and such other laws as may be applicable.

FOURTH CLASS POSTMASTER EXAMINATION.

To Be Held Saturday, July 8, at Bogalusa, La., for Postmaster at Sun, La.

The United States Civil Service Commission announces that on the date named above an examination will be held at Bogalusa, La., as a result of which it is expected to make certification to fill a contemplated vacancy in the position of 4th class postmaster at Sun, and other vacancies as they may occur at that office, unless it shall be decided in the interests of the service to fill the vacancy by reinstatement. The compensation of the postmaster at this office was \$453 for the last fiscal year.

Age limit, 21 years and over on the date of the examination, with the exception that in a State where women are declared by statute to be of full age for all purposes at 18 years, women 18 years of age on the date of the examination will be admitted.

Applicants must reside within the territory supplied by the post office for which the examination is announced.

The examination is open to all citizens of the United States who can comply with the requirements. Application forms and full information concerning the requirements of the examination can be secured from the postmaster at Sun, or from the U. S. Civil Service Commission, Washington, D. C.

Applications should be properly executed and filed with the Commission at Washington at least 7 days before the date of the examination, otherwise it may be impracticable to examine the applicants.
