

PROCLAMATION.

State of Louisiana, Parish of St. Tammany, Town of Covington. Notice of Election. Whereas, the office of D. J. Sanders, duly elected Alderman of the Town Council of the town of Covington, La., was declared to be vacant by the Town Council of the said town of Covington, La., at a regular session of said council on the first day of August, 1916, because of the fact that said Alderman, D. J. Sanders, has absented himself from the State of Louisiana and the town of Covington, under such circumstances and for such period of time as to negative any presumption of his return or any intention on his part to resume the duties incumbent in such office;

Therefore, I, P. J. Lacroix, Mayor of said town, acting upon the authority of a resolution to that effect adopted by the town council on said date of its regular meeting, and under and by virtue of the authority vested in me by the charter of said town of Covington, do hereby declare that a vacancy exists in the town council of the town of Covington, and do hereby give notice that an election will be held in the town of Covington, La., at the courthouse on Boston street, for the purpose of electing one member for the town council, to fill the unexpired term of said D. J. Sanders, on the 26th day of September, 1916. Said polls shall open at 6 o'clock a. m., and close at 7 o'clock p. m., on said day, in accordance with the provisions of the town charter and general election laws of the State, and said election shall be held under the control and supervision of S. D. Anderson, Chas. Sheffeld, Wm. Kennedy, commissioners, and Sen. Blossman, clerk, and such persons as may be appointed and designated as commissioners and clerk to conduct said election according to law.

Any citizen of the town of Covington desiring to become a candidate for the office of Alderman in the place and stead of said D. J. Sanders, vacated, shall file a written declaration of his candidacy with the Town Clerk at the town hall on Boston street, on or before the 21st day of September, 1916, before 12 o'clock m.

OFFICIAL NOTICES.

ORDINANCES.

An ordinance to levy and collect a tax on dogs throughout the Parish of St. Tammany.

Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Tammany, that there shall be levied each year for the benefit of the public schools of this Parish an annual license tax of \$2.00 per head on all dogs throughout the parish.

Sec. 2. Be it further ordained, etc., That the sheriff of the parish of St. Tammany, be, and he is hereby empowered and instructed to collect the said tax from the owner or owners of any dog or dogs in the parish, and that his fee shall be fixed at 25 per cent of the amounts collected, and to that end he may designate such person or persons as he may see fit to collect the said license throughout the respective wards of the parish.

Sec. 3. Be it further ordained, etc., That the said license tax collector shall notify all delinquent dog owners in writing, and require of them the amount due for dog license, for each year hereafter, and that after ten days written notice to the said owner or owners, it shall be lawful, and said collector for dog license, or any deputy sheriff, constable, or deputy constable, shall be empowered, and they are hereby instructed to destroy any dog which shall be found at large, whose owner has not protected it with a license required by this ordinance.

Sec. 4. Be it further ordained, etc., That the president of the police jury, be, and he is hereby authorized to purchase such tags as shall be necessary for the purpose of issuing the proper license to the owners of dogs.

Sec. 5. Be it further ordained, etc., That any person or persons interfering in any manner with any officer charged with the execution of this ordinance are hereby declared to be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be liable to suffer a fine in the sum not to exceed \$25.00, or imprisonment in the parish jail for a period

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not exceeding 30 days, or both, at the discretion of the Court.

Sec. 6. Be it further ordained, etc., That all the licenses and penalties collected under this act for the benefit of the public schools as here-in provided, shall be appropriated by the school board to the use of the schools of each ward, according to the licenses and penalties realized from their respective sections.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances to the contrary notwithstanding are hereby repealed.

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AN ORDINANCE.

Be it ordained by the police jury of the parish of St. Tammany, in accordance with Act No. 227 of 1914 and section 2 of the constitution of 1913, that there is hereby created what shall be known as Drainage District No. 1 situated in the parish of St. Tammany. The purpose and object of this Drainage District shall be for the reclamation and drainage of the following described property, to-wit:

Belonging to George Koopp, Sr.—All section 28.

Belonging to George H. Koopp—Beginning at the southwest corner of northwest quarter section 33 of 1760' n, 2640' w, 1760' south to point of beginning. Containing 105 acres.

Belonging to Edward Koopp—Beginning at a stake set on section line of 33 which stake is 1760' east of northwest corner section 33, thence 3, 1760' s, 2640' w, 1760' n, 2640' to point of beginning. Containing 105 acres.

Belonging to Robert Koopp—Beginning at the northeast corner section 33, thence south 2640' to southeast corner of northeast quarter of section 33, thence west 1760' to stake, thence north 2640' to stake thence east 1760' to point of beginning. Containing 105 acres.

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Commissioners is hereby established and designated at Covington, Louisiana, parish of St. Tammany, and that all the meetings of the said Drainage Commissioners shall be held at Covington, Louisiana, on the first Tuesday of each month, at 10 o'clock a. m., in said town of Covington, Louisiana, that an appropriate seal shall be made and used by the said Drainage Commissioners, and they shall have all the powers of a body corporate.

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AN ORDINANCE.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the police jury of the parish of St. Tammany, La., that there be and is hereby levied for the year 1916 a tax of 7 mills upon the dollar upon all taxable property in the parish, for general parochial purposes, and 3 mill for school purposes, as follows:

That 4 mills are hereby apportioned therefrom for criminal expenses 3 mills for public schools, 1 mill for general expenses and 2 mills for the benefit of public roads, upon all property in the parish subject to taxation, including that situated in the towns of Covington and Mandeville. Except that the towns of Covington and Mandeville shall be exempt from the payment of the mill for general purposes.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., That the sheriff and tax collector shall receive in payment of parish taxes (the amount appropriated to public school excepted) the fully approved certificates of the grand and petit juror, for per diem and mileage, and certificates of the members of police jury for per diem and mileage, and that he proceed with the collection of taxes now levied according to law.

2. To incur debt and issue bonds to the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars to run not longer than 20 years from date and to bear interest not exceeding five per cent per annum payable semi-annually for the purpose of constructing and furnishing a public school building in District No. 10 and purchasing a site, if necessary, for said school building, within said school district, title to which shall vest in the public.
