number of meetings have been held in this parish for the purpose of showing the Federal Bank Committee comington New Orleans, this month, the interest we had in getting the bank located in New Orleans, and at the same time how we would use it if we had the chance. Our farmers have come out better than we expected, and at this writing we have applications for over three hundred thousand dollars in loans by farmers. If that much money can be spent in nothing but improving farms and live stock—and that is all it can be spent for—in the next two years in St. Tammany we know that great strides will be made in agricultural improvement. We know that many blooded animals will take the place of the razor-back, many best type animals will take the place of the high-hipped long-horn cattle, big plows will take the place of the "diamond stock," cultivators will take the place of the old-time side barrow and cultivation will take the place of plowing our growing crops. Good barns can be built to hold the large crops that can be grown and harvested by getting the stumps out and by using these improved implements and the country put on a prosperous foundation. Many farmers would do better if they had the chance; many know they are not doing anything but are afraid to make a start for fear that they will lose their home and farm. The Federal Bank solves the problem. It places the farmer where he can get in on a good footing and do real business, as far as farming is concerned, on money which he has almost a lifetime to pay back—and at a low rate of interest.

When the farmers of St. Tammany take up this thing and think over it seriously they cannot help but ask for some of this money with which they can prepare themselves to make money by farming instead of dragging along and barely living on a much-run-down farm.

SCHOOL BOARD PROCEEDINGS OF OCT. 30.

Covington, La., Oct. 30, 1916.
The building committee of the Parish School Board appointed on September 20th met on October 10, 1916, for the purpose of opening bids and awarding contract for the erection of the four-room school house at Tishbeek, as per advertisement appearing in official journal.

The following bids were received:
J. E. Smith, \$3338.00.
C. V. Quave, \$3436.00.
It was moved by Mr. Parker and seconded by Mr. Evans, that the contract be awarded to Mr. Quave at the amount of his bid.

It was also moved by Mr. Parker and seconded by Mr. Evans, that certain changes be made in the specifications if the consent of the architect be obtained and that the change in price, if any, caused by the change in specifications, be made under approval of the architect. Carried.

On October 23 the special committee appointed on October 5 and consisting of Geo. R. Dutsch, the president and superintendent met in the office of the superintendent and opened the bids for operating the school transfers for the Madisonville school, as follows:
To run from Jno. Peters place to Madisonville and return: William Koepf, \$49.00; Jos. Stein, \$70.00.
To run from Edwards school to Madisonville and return: Louis Galatas, \$50.00 per month.

It was unanimously agreed to give the contract to Mr. Koepf and Mr. Galatas, according to their bids, and that they should be ready to sign contract and offer bond so that no delay be caused in opening school on November 6, 1916, if possible.

A special meeting of the school board was held in the office of the superintendent on September 24th, with the following members present: N. H. Fitzsimons, C. B. Wills, H. Q. Parker, T. P. Crawford, G. E. Miller. Absent: G. R. Dutsch, T. O'Keefe, W. H. Kahl, Dr. C. F. Farmer, C. M. Liddle.

Hon. John T. Lasley, member of the State Board of Education appeared before the board and addressed the board in regard to the matter of employing an attorney to collect any money that may belong to the board because of the 16th section lands.

Moved by Mr. Wills and seconded by Mr. Parker, that whatever action the board takes regarding 16th section lands, other than the resolution passed October 5, 1916, regarding an agreement with Iron, Thos. E. Furlow, of New Orleans, shall be only with special approval of the attorney of the board. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Wills and seconded by Mr. Miller, that the board donate \$120 toward a school house for the White Settlement colored school, with the understanding that the teacher be furnished them for year
